## RE: Human Papillomavirus (HPV) Vaccine – NEW Eligibility Criteria

**HPV** vaccine is now available free-of-charge to:

• Females 9 to ≤ 26 years of age with increased risk of getting HPV, as determined by a health care provider.

## Risk factors *can* include:

- Early onset of sexual activity
- Multiple sex partners
- A previous sexually transmitted infection (STI)
- Adolescent pregnancy
- An immune system weakened by disease or medical treatment
- Previous abnormal Pap tests
- Family history of HPV-associated cancers

The Questions and Answers for Public Health Nurses document ( <a href="http://www.gov.mb.ca/health/publichealth/cdc/docs/hpv\_phn.pdf">http://www.gov.mb.ca/health/publichealth/cdc/docs/hpv\_phn.pdf</a>) is currently being updated and will provide additional information to assist providers in assessing a patient's risk for getting HPV.

Immunization providers are encouraged to consult with the Manitoba Immunization Monitoring System (MIMS) and/or eChart to determine if an individual has already received any doses of HPV vaccine.

## **Promotion:**

Starting in December, Manitoba Health will be promoting the new criteria by:

- Having awareness raising posters available to be ordered from our website (refer to link below) for health care providers to post in public areas where girls/women and parents/guardians frequent
- Employing social media tools (i.e. Facebook, Twitter)
- Updating the HPV information on the website including posting a new factsheet specific for the school-based program

Manitoba Health is also planning to mail a reminder letter in January 2013 to parents/guardians of girls born in 1997 or later who missed 0, 1 or 2 doses of the HPV vaccine when they were in Grade 6.
