2014-15 Seasonal Influenza Immunization Program

Manitoba Health, Healthy Living and Seniors will continue to offer a Universal Seasonal Influenza Immunization Program for the 2014-15 season. All Manitobans over 6 months of age will be eligible to receive the seasonal influenza vaccine free of charge. Health care providers are encouraged to offer seasonal influenza vaccine to all Manitobans at every opportunity.

Manitoba will have three seasonal influenza vaccines available this year as part of the provincial universal program, including FluMist®, the live attenuated intranasal vaccine. FluMist® can be offered to healthy children and adolescents 2 to 17 years of age.
