INTRODUCTION

The Manitoba Estimates of Revenue for the Fiscal Year Ending March 31, 2005 detail the revenue projections of the government as presented in The 2004 Manitoba Budget. Estimates of expenditure for the same period are detailed in a separate document, Manitoba Estimates of Expenditure for the Fiscal Year Ending March 31, 2005.

Prior Year Estimates of Revenue

In order to make year-over-year comparisons meaningful, adjustments to the previous year's estimates figures may be necessary. These adjustments may reflect organizational changes, as well as any other adjustments that may be required to ensure comparability. Normally, the total of the previous year's estimates of revenue do not change as a result of these adjustments. However, beginning in 2004/05, the province's accounting policy has been changed to allow for capitalization of infrastructure, in accordance with the Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants (CICA) public sector accounting standards. Under this accounting policy change, third party recoveries of capital asset acquisition costs previously shown in the 2003 Manitoba Estimates of Revenue under the heading "Government of Canada" are now shown separately as "Less: Third Party Recoveries" under the related infrastructure budget authority in the 2004 Manitoba Estimates of Expenditure for Part B - Capital Investment. As a result, the 2003/04 figures have been adjusted in these revenue estimates to reflect this change and the departmental reorganization that occurred in November 2003.

Categorization of Revenues

Revenues are grouped by the three major sources: Taxation, Other Revenue and Government of Canada. Within each of these major sources, additional information is provided on the department responsible for collection and the type of revenue.

Estimates Supplement

Additional detail on estimates of revenue is available in the Supplementary Information for Legislative Review document that is prepared annually by the Department of Finance in order to assist Members of the Legislative Assembly in their review of the revenue estimates.
