Fall with Hip Fracture

Summary:

The client was standing in the bathroom with a staff member. When the staff member moved away from the client, the client moved unexpectedly and fell to the floor. The fall resulted in a fractured hip.

Findings of the Review:

- The client was unable to sit or stand independently due to weakness on one side which was documented in the mobility assessment notes.
- Lack of documentation on the resident's care plan of the individualized interventions required may have contributed to miscommunication about the need for a two-person assist and increased the risk of a fall.
- Documentation of the assistance that the resident required was inconsistent within different sections of the health record. This contributed to variation in practice.

System Learning:

- Promote staff education regarding the Falls Prevention and Management Policy and Procedure.
- Reinforce regional policy and procedure related to documentation in the resident health record.
