In accordance with the Manitoba Environment Act (C.C.S.M. c. E125)

THIS LICENCE IS ISSUED TO:

**THE PROVINCE OF MANITOBA REPRESENTED BY THE  
MINISTER OF HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION: "the Licencee"**

for the construction and operation of the Development being the upgrading of Provincial Road #355 by its extension along an existing municipal road right-of-way from PTH #21 for a distance of 4.8 km. in the Rural Municipality of Hamiota subject to the following specifications, limits, terms and conditions:

**SPECIFICATIONS, LIMITS, TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

- 1) The Licencee shall construct the Development in accordance with the Department of Highways & Transportation Environment Act Proposal, *Proposed Upgrading of Provincial Road #355 (PTH 21 Easterly) R.M. of Hamiota*, dated June 17, 1994.
- 2) The Licencee shall, prior to construction, consult and reach an agreement with the Department of Natural Resources Regional Wildlife staff, regarding a site specific plan to minimize disturbance to waterfowl production on the wetland areas affected by the Development.
- 3) The Licencee shall, from May 1 to July 15 of each year during construction, avoid where possible, construction activities that may impact upon wetland areas and which may affect waterfowl breeding and brooding.
- 4) The Licencee shall, in wetlands related to the Development where wooden structures are required, use wood poles treated with chromated copper arsenate (CCA).
- 5) The Licencee shall, prior to construction, notify the Department of Natural Resources Regional Wildlife staff regarding the pre-construction meeting scheduled to be held in accordance with the *Mitigative Measures* identified under *Section 5* of the *Environment Act Proposal Proposed Upgrading of Provincial Road #355 (PTH 21 Easterly) R.M. of Hamiota*, dated June 17, 1994.
- 6) The Licencee shall, during construction, ensure that all fuel storage areas associated with the Development are located a minimum distance of 100 meters away from wetlands, and ensure that the storage areas comply with the requirements of *Manitoba Regulation 97/88R* respecting *Storage and Handling of Gasoline and Associated Products Regulation*.

- 7) The Licencee shall, during and upon completion of construction of the Development, collect and dispose of all waste petroleum products generated by the construction activities in accordance with all applicable regulatory requirements.
- 8) The Licencee shall, during the full term of the construction of the Development, cleanup and deposit all debris from the construction site at a Waste Disposal Ground operating under the authority of a permit issued pursuant to *Manitoba Regulation 150/91R* respecting *Waste Disposal Grounds*.

### REVOCATION

If in the opinion of the Director the Licencee has exceeded or is exceeding the limits, or has not complied or is not complying with the specifications, terms and conditions set out herein, the Director may revoke, temporarily or permanently, this Licence.
