

AN ORDER OF THE CLEAN ENVIRONMENT COMMISSION

UNDER THE CLEAN ENVIRONMENT ACT

RE: THE CLEAN ENVIRONMENT COMMISSION and ELECTROLIER CORPORATION, Applicant,

WHEREAS pursuant to the provisions of The Clean Environment Act, Electrolier Corporation filed a proposal with the Department of Mines, Resources and Environmental Management in connection with the operation of a plant for the manufacture of electrical appliances located on or near the northeast corner at the intersection of Sheppard Street and Inkster Boulevard on the Western 588.9 feet of Block 3, Plan 6464 DGS Kildonan, also known as W. 71.5 feet of Parcel 9 and 10 to 12, Plan 7743 DGS Kildonan, in the City of Winnipeg, Manitoba;

AND WHEREAS in the absence of limits being prescribed by a Regulation under the said Act, the proposal was referred to The Clean Environment Commission for the prescribing of limits;

AND WHEREAS representation was made to the said Commission by a person who is, or is likely to be, affected by an Order of The Commission setting limits in connection with the said operation;

AND WHEREAS the said Commission held a public hearing for the purpose of hearing evidence in connection with the said proposal on the 18th day of March, 1975, in the Board Room of Building 2 of the Fort Osborne Complex at 139 Tuxedo Avenue, Winnipeg;

AND WHEREAS the said Commission considered the said proposal on the 15th day of July, 1975;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT

1. The Applicant shall ensure that, on and after the 1st day of March, 1976:
 - (a) at any point of impingement off the site of the said operation, the odour emanating from the said operation shall not be detectable in any area zoned residential or commercial, when one volume of odourous air is diluted with one volume of odour-free air;

1. (b) solid particulate emissions from any stack or vent of the said operation shall not exceed 0.57 grams per standard cubic meter calculated at 20° Celsius and 760 millimeters of mercury (0.25 grains per standard cubic foot calculated at 68° Fahrenheit and 30 inches of mercury) at the point of emission.
2. The Applicant shall ensure that a high standard of maintenance and housekeeping are maintained consistent with meeting the limits prescribed in this Order.
