

## FARM CASH RECEIPTS ESTIMATES\* JANUARY – SEPTEMBER 2004<sup>R</sup> - 2006<sup>P</sup>

Revenues from the sale of crops and livestock in Manitoba declined in the first nine months of 2006, primarily the result of a large drop in crop receipts. From January to September 2006, Manitoba farmers generated \$2.1 billion in gross revenue from markets, down 9.2% from the same period one year ago and 15.9% below the previous five-year average from 2001 to 2005.



In the first nine months of 2006, revenues of \$837.4 million from the sale of crops were down 14.4% from \$977.8 million in 2005, their lowest level since 1994 and 30.8% below the previous five-year average. Flooding and excess moisture impacted both the quantity and quality of the 2005 harvest while abundant world grain supplies and a strong Canadian dollar contributed to further reductions in crop prices. However, the decline was cushioned by an 11.5% increase in prices from the very low levels last year.

Livestock revenues fell 5.3% to \$1.2 billion as a substantial decline in hog revenue offset higher receipts from cattle and calf production.

Total program payments in the first nine months of 2006 were \$505.6 million in Manitoba, up 2.5% from the previous record set in the first three quarters of 2005 and nearly double the previous five-year average of \$262 million.
