

FARM CASH RECEIPTS ESTIMATES*

JANUARY – SEPTEMBER 2005^R - 2008^P

In the first nine months of 2008 total farm cash receipts including program payments, rose 12.0% to \$3.62 billion in Manitoba. Revenues from the sale of crops and livestock for Manitoba farmers reached \$3.33 billion as a result of rising crop prices, an increase of 13.5% from \$2.94 billion from the same time period in 2007.



From January to September, revenues of \$2,129 million from the sale of Manitoba crops were up 31.1% from \$1,624 million in 2007. The increase was due to higher prices resulting from pressured tight world grain supplies and strong demand. In the 2008 period, canola receipts were \$765.7 million, an increase of 44.8% from \$528.7 million in 2007 while total wheat receipts were \$491.7 million, up from \$298.1 million in 2007.

Livestock revenues were \$1,204 million in the first nine months of 2008, down 8.3% from \$1,313 million in same period in 2007. In the 2008 period, cattle receipts were up 2.9% at \$360.6 million, receipts from the sales of calves were down 17.0% at \$10.3 million, hog receipts were down 22.7% at \$494.7 million, as lower prices resulting from the appreciation of the Canadian dollar and higher feed costs drove down revenues.

Program Payments in the 2008 period continued the downward trend evident in 2006-07, with total direct payments equal to \$283.1 million, down 3.1% from the same period a year ago.
