# Cormorant

## Community Status

Cormorant is situated on the east shore of Cormorant Lake, in west-central Manitoba, 48 kilometres Northeast of The Pas. The Hudson Bay Railway, owned and operated by Omni Trax Ltd. passes through the community.

The main section of the community is on a point along the north shore of "The Narrows" which connects Cormorant Lake with Little Cormorant Lake. A single-lane timber bridge and causeway connect the balance of the community on the south shore of the "The Narrows." PR #287 provides access from PTH #10 going to The Pas.

## Emergency Services

### Fire

Fire fighting capability is based on a pumper truck and equipment from the community fire hall. Portable forestry equipment is also available for grass and brush fires.

### Police

### Medical

Medical services consist of a nursing station staffed by a registered nurse and a community health worker. Ambulance and hospital services can be obtained from The Pas.

### Water

Water supply is taken from community wells and distributed after filtration and chlorination. Distribution system presently serves most of Cormorant.

### Waste Disposal

A solid waste disposal site exists near the community.

Sewage is treated by a lagoon on the North side of the community and a new Extended Aeration Treatment Plant on the South side of the Community. The North and south sides of the community are serviced by low-pressure sewage mains. Sewage holding tanks service the area known as McKenzie's Point.

### **Economic Overview**

Cormorant's physical location in a relatively flat marshy region, which is part of the Palaeozoic geological zone of Manitoba, is a factor in economic development. To the west, and surrounding Cormorant Lake, is the Cormorant Forest Reserve. The remaining forest areas surrounding Cormorant are part of Tolko Manitoba's logging area.

The present and potential economic activity is based upon commercial fishing, trapping, forestry and tourism. Potential mineral reserves are also found within 80 kilometres of the community.

The Pas fish station serves Cormorant fishermen. The Cormorant Lodge caters to sports fishers and a number of residents provide guide services to the lodge. The Cormorant Campground and Cormorant Lake campground provide additional tourist facilities for sports hunting and fishing.

Wild rice is planted in the shallow areas of nearby lakes.
