
Incorporated Community of Cross Lake

Community Status

Two closely related, adjoining but independent communities are known as Cross Lake. One is located on the Cross Lake Indian Reserve, and the other is on nearby provincial crown land. The information in this report relates to the off reserve community unless noted.

The community is located about 520 kilometres by air north of Winnipeg, and 120 kilometres by air south of Thompson. It is situated on the shores of the Nelson River where the river enters Cross Lake.

The government of the community has been represented by a mayor and council under *The Northern Affairs Act* since September 1970.

Emergency Services

Fire

Fire fighting capability is based on a pumper truck and equipment from the community fire hall. Portable forestry equipment is also available for grass and brush fires. Community water trucks provide back-up water supply.

Police

Police response is from the Cross Lake detachment, RCMP, phone: (204) 676-2345.

Medical

Medical response comes from the federal nursing station based in the area. It is staffed by doctors, nurses, dentist and community health workers. There is also an Emergency Rescue - First Response Team as part of the fire department operations, as well as a community-operated Provincial ambulance service.

Telephone

Manitoba Telecom Services provides individual-line service and digital switching with toll-free calling to Thompson and Norway House. Call MTS toll-free at (204) 225-5687. Cellular service is also available in the community.

Water

Water is pumped from Cross Lake to a chemical feed treatment plant where it is filtered, chlorinated and fed to a reservoir. Ninety percent of the community has piped distribution. The remainder of the community has trucked water delivery.

Waste Disposal

Garbage pickup service is twice a week on a contract basis, and waste material is delivered to the solid-waste disposal site.

Sewage is collected by pump-out truck from those homes not on the low-pressure and gravity systems. The sewage is delivered to a sewage lift station, which empties into a wastewater lagoon capable of handling 305,400 litres/day.

Schools

Frontier School Division operates the D. R. Hamilton School in the community. The reserve has two schools. Staff comprise the principal, five teachers and several support staff. Phone: (204) 676-2278.

Economic Overview

Present economic activity includes fishing, trapping and local services. Fisherman from Cross Lake, Walker Lake, and Pipestone Lake deliver their fish catch to the Wabowden fish station.

Trappers have trap lines in the Cross Lake Registered Trap Line Zone.

Small deposits of lithium, copper and titanium are known in the immediate area, but currently are not economically recoverable.
