Community Status

Meadow Portage is located on a narrow strip of land between Lake Manitoba and Lake Winnipegosis, about 16 kilometres south of Waterhen and 48 kilometres to the east of Winnipegosis.

Meadow Portage developed as ranching and agricultural activities took place in the area. Since 1970, it has been recognized by the department and is currently governed by a mayor and council under *The Northern Affairs Act*.

Fire

Fire fighting capability is based on a well-equipped pumper truck from the community fire hall. Portable forestry equipment and a water trailer are also available for grass and brush fires. The volunteer fire department is a member of the Winnipegosis Mutual Aid District. All volunteers are equipped with Fleet Net Telephones. Call 911 for emergency service.

Water

Water is pumped once a year when there is minimum turbidity from Lake Manitoba into a reservoir. In turn, it is filtered and chlorinated and pumped and stored in the pumphouse where residents can pick up quantities as required.

Waste Disposal

A solid-waste disposal site is provided; Hours of operation year round are Wednesday; 9:00 – 11:00 am and additional hours during the summer from 2:00 – 4:00 pm Sundays.

Sewage is treated by means of septic tank and fields by the individual home owners.
