# Princess Harbour

## Community Status

Princess Harbour is positioned on a small peninsula on the east shore of Lake Winnipeg. The community is approximately 304 air km north of Winnipeg, 24 km north-west of Long Body Creek and 65 km by air south of Berens River.

There are no roads into the community but it is served by air and by ferry or barge service on Lake Winnipeg, in season.

Princess Harbour, recognized in 1972, has a contact person representing the community under *The Northern Affairs Act*.

Fishing on Lake Winnipeg is the major source of employment. The Princess Harbour fish station handles the catch from local fishers and the surrounding area.

Some trapping occurs in the Bloodvein Registered Trap Line zone.

The operation of the ferry between the Islandview portion of Matheson Island community, Princess Harbour and Bloodvein also brings in income to the community.
