## Community Status

Sherridon originated as the service centre for the nearby Sherritt Gordon nickel mines. The mine closed in 1940, resulting in the equipment and many of the workers and families relocating to Lynn Lake. A recent gold mine, operated by Pioneer Metals at Puffy Lake, closed in 1989.

The community is located on the Keewatin rail line to Pukatawagan about 156 km north of The Pas. The Reserve is 72 km further of Sherridon. A 78 km community-access gravelled road was constructed as part of the Puffy Lake Mine development, and the community is now connected to PTH #10 between Cranberry Portage and Flin Flon.

Sherridon is governed by a mayor and council, under *The Northern Affairs Act*.

## Emergency Services

### Fire

Fire fighting capability is based on a pumper truck and equipment from the community fire hall. Portable forestry equipment is also available for grass and brush fires.

### Police

Police response is from the Cranberry Portage detachment, RCMP, phone (204) 472-4044.

### Medical

Medical response is based on services of a community health worker. Higher-level care requires transporting the patient to the nearest hospital in Flin Flon. The community qualifies for Patient Air Transport assistance.

Provided by Manitoba Hydro as land-line electric power. Residential rates are:

### Water

Treated water is distributed by distribution lines to both parts of the community, Sherridon and Cold Lake.

### Waste Disposal

A solid-waste disposal site is located nearby.

An extended aeration sewage treatment plant serves the Sherridon portion of the community. The Cold Lake portion, still requires private pumpout services.

### Schools

The Cold Lake School, in Sherridon, is operated by the Frontier School Division with one teacher/principal and one support staff. Phone (204) 468-2021

## **Economic Overview**

Economic opportunities include commercial fishing, trapping, mining, forestry, some tourism support, and some wild rice harvesting in nearby lakes.

Fishing on the nearby Kississing Lake is divided between commercial and recreational interests. Commercial fishers deliver their catch to The Pas fish station.

Seasonal logging in the area produces pulp-logs for the Tolko Manitoba Inc. pulp mill at The Pas.

Both Kississing Lodge and others are located on Cold Lake, and divide the tourism between them. This is a major employment area in season.

Although there is opportunity for mining in the area, a nearby mine was recently closed, based on economic considerations but has since been purchased by Auriga Gold Corp. of Toronto who are undergoing and extensive diamond drilling program. Exploration by Halo Resources is ongoing since 2007. Mine remediation of abandoned mine site in progress.
