

In 2015, the federal government pledged to
“...negotiate a new Health Accord with provinces and
territories, including a long-term agreement on funding.”

As of January 2017, no such negotiations have taken place.

Under the federal offer made to other provinces, Manitoba would
receive **\$18 million less** from the federal government in 2017/18,
and more than **\$1 billion less** over the next ten years.




