

**Suggested Example**  
**of a Puppy/Kitten Health and Warranty Information**

**Health guarantee:**

The puppy or kitten you have purchased is guaranteed to be in good health and has received the appropriate medical attention and vaccinations up to the time of purchase. The breeder will provide the buyer with medical documentation of all treatment the puppy/kitten has received and care recommendations for future health. It is recommended that buyer has puppy/kitten examined by a veterinarian of the buyers choice within the first 72 hours of purchase to validate guarantee.

**Warranty:**

Should the puppy/kitten experience medical problems that originated from before the time of purchase and greatly affect the puppies/kittens quality of life the following options are available:

- A) If the buyer chooses to return the puppy/kitten, the breeder will reassume care for the puppy/kitten and refund purchase price less any shipping or miscellaneous charges necessary for transportation.
- B) If the buyer chooses to maintain ownership of puppy/kitten the breeder will refund purchase price less any shipping or miscellaneous charges necessary for transportation.
- C) Veterinarian expenses incurred by the buyer will not be responsibility of the breeder.

***Appropriate verification of medical condition obtained from a licenced veterinarian must be provided for A & B above options.***

## General Care Instructions:

Arrange for an appointment with your veterinarian within the first few days of receiving your puppy/kitten to ensure it's health, establish a vaccination program, as well to examine for any problems that may be corrected with early detection.

Before you bring your puppy/kitten home it is a good idea to modify your home by:

- removal or coverage of all chewable and swallowable objects (electric cords, small objects, etc.).
- some plants in the house may be poisonous such as, azalea, daffodil, rhododendron, oleander, mistletoe, hydrangea, morning glory, dieffenbachia, sago palm, Easter lily, and yew plants.
- secure all toxic materials (cleaning products, antifreeze, medication).
- your puppy/kitten will need a quite safe place to call its own and will sleep a lot in its early weeks. (It might not be a bad idea to ask your breeder for a toy or small piece of blanket that has the smell of its mother and littermates to provide comfort in the first few nights.)

Avoid public places with your puppy/kitten until all it's vaccinations are complete. Minimize the amount of stress during the initial adjustment period to the new environment.

**Feeding instructions:** Your puppy/kitten should be fed three times a day. Avoid food labeled maintenance, or adults only, as they will not contain the sufficient amount of fat or protein. Introduce new food gradually. If you have a large-breed puppy, purchase "large breed" puppy food. The actual formula is different, not just the kibble size, and is better for very rapidly growing puppies. Provide your puppy/kitten with constant access to fresh water.

**Grooming and handling:** In the first few weeks it's a good idea to get your puppy/kitten used to being handled and groomed. Exposure to these behaviors in the early weeks will make it much easier throughout your puppies/kittens life. Touch the paws and nails, look in the ears and mouth, and examine the entire body often without restraining or causing fear.
