Stage 2 Licence

for the construction, operation and maintenance of the Development being the upgrading of a section of Provincial Road 354 from the west limit of 32-19-19W to Provincial Road 250 in the Local Government District of Park and in accordance with the additional information to the Proposal filed under The Environment Act on May 6, 1996 and subject to the following specifications, limits, terms and conditions:

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

This Section of the Licence contains requirements intended to provide guidance to the Licencee in implementing practices to ensure that the environment is maintained in such a manner as to sustain a high quality of life, including social and economic development, recreation and leisure for present and future Manitobans.

- 1. The Licencee shall, during construction, ensure that any fuel storage areas established for the construction of the Development are located a minimum distance of 100 meters away from waterbodies including wetlands and ensure the storage areas comply with the requirements of *Manitoba Regulation 97/88R Storage and Handling of Gasoline and Associated Products*.
- 2. The Licencee shall ensure that all used petroleum products and other hazardous wastes generated by the machinery used in the construction and operation of the Development are collected and disposed of in accordance with Manitoba Environment and legislative requirements.
- 3. The Licencee shall, prior to construction, provide a copy of this Licence to the contractor involved in the Development.

SPECIFICATIONS, LIMITS, TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 4. The Licencee shall, prior to construction start-up, instruct the on-site project construction supervisor to arrange a pre-construction meeting with representatives of Manitoba Environment's regional office in Brandon and the Manitoba Department of Natural Resources Regional Fisheries Manager in Brandon.
- 5. The Licencee shall, prior to construction start-up, instruct the on-site project construction supervisor to ensure that no private land, other than the land required for the temporary detour and borrow sites, will be affected by clearing, grading or filling of wetland areas during construction of the Development.
- 6. The Licencee shall, during construction, adhere to pages 8-9 and 12-17 and the general recommendations on design, construction and maintenance of stream crossings as specified in the Manitoba Department of Natural Resources guidelines titled *Recommended Fish Protection Procedures for Stream Crossings in Manitoba*.
- 7. The Licencee shall not begin any construction activities that will impact upon the Wasamin Creek stream channel until after July 1 of each year during construction.
- 8. The Licencee shall, prior to completion of construction, instruct the on-site supervisor to arrange a meeting with representatives of Manitoba Natural Resources in Brandon for the purpose of developing appropriate rehabilitation measures for the detour areas and borrow pit sites associated with the Development.

- 9. The Licencee shall, at the completion of the construction of the Development, landscape and vegetate all areas disturbed during the construction with native plant species and cultivars.
- 10. The Licencee shall, during the full term of the construction of the Development, cleanup and deposit debris from the construction site including the treated bridge timbers at a Waste Disposal Ground operating under the authority of a permit issued pursuant to *Manitoba Regulation 150/91* respecting *Waste Disposal Grounds*.

REVIEW AND REVOCATION

- A. If, in the opinion of the Director, the Licencee has exceeded or is exceeding or has or is failing to meet the specifications, limits, terms, or conditions set out in this Licence, the Director may, temporarily or permanently, revoke this Licence.
- B. If, in the opinion of the Director, new evidence warrants a change in the specifications, limits, terms or conditions of this Licence, the Director may require the filing of a new proposal pursuant to Section 11 of The Environment Act.
