IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE MANITOBA ENVIRONMENT ACT (C.C.S.M. c. E125) THIS LICENCE IS ISSUED PURSUANT TO SECTION 10(1) TO:

GJ SEED SERVICE - R.M. OF FRANKLIN; "the Licencee"

for the construction and operation of the Development being a crop protection products warehouse, a seed cleaning/storage, and distribution facilities located on the NW¹/₄ 27-3-3 EPM in the Rural Municipality of Franklin, and in accordance with the Proposal filed under The Environment Act on February 14, 2000, and subject to the following specifications, limits, terms and conditions:

DEFINITIONS

In this Licence,

"accredited laboratory" means any facility accredited by the Standard Councard Crada (SCC); or facilities accredited by another accrediting agency recognized by Manitoba Conservation to the equivalent to the SCC; or any facility able to demonstrate to Manitoba Conservation, upon request, the international to the quality assurance/quality control (QA/QC) procedures in place equivalent to accreditation based on the Canadian Analyse Can/CSA-Z753, extension of the international standard ISO 9000, Guide 25;

"affected area" means a geographical area excluding the property of the proper

"ambient concentration" means the measurement of a sur fance. Used in an air sample (corrected to a temperature of 25° C and to a pressure of 101.3 kiloparals) which has been collected from any point beyond the property line of the Development;

"chemical" includes, but is not limited to perfoleum products, ertilizers and pesticides;

"Director" means an employee so designated ursuant to The Environment Act;

"noise nuisance" means an unwar ed sound in an affected area, which is annoying, troublesome, or disagreeable to a person:

- a. residing in an affect a area;
- b. working in an affected are, o
- c. present at a location of affected area which is normally open to the members of the public;

if the unwanted ound

d. is the subject of at least 5 written complaints, received by the Director in a form satisfactory to the Director, and within a 90 d, period, from 5 different persons falling within clauses a), b), or c), who do not live in the same household;

"opacity" means the degree to which emissions reduce the transmission of light and obscure the view of an object in the background;

"particulate matter" means any finely divided liquid or solid matter other than water droplets;

"particulate residue" means that part or portion of an atmospheric emission which is deposited onto a surface;

"**pesticide storage structure(s)**" means any building(s) where agricultural crop protection products are stored for either commercial or retail purposes;

"**point source**" means any point of emission from a Development where pollutants are ducted into the atmosphere; and

"sewage" means human body, toilet, liquid, waterborne culinary, sink or laundry waste.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

This Section of the Licence contains requirements intended to provide guidance to the Licencee in implementing practices to ensure that the environment is maintained in such a manner as to sustain a high quality of life, including social and economic development, recreation and leisure for present and future Manitobans.

- 1. The Licencee shall comply with the current edition of the Crop Protection Institute of Canada's warehousing standards regarding the handling and storage of crop protection chemicals, and with a appropriate federal and provincial regulations.
- 2. The Licencee shall install and maintain, for all pesticide storage structure(s) on automate system(s) for fire detection and security.
- 3. The Licencee shall, at all times during the operation of the Development, ence that a righ standard of equipment maintenance and operational practices are implemented.
- 4. The Licencee shall reduce the production and dissemination of ustes by in lating and maintaining waste reduction and waste recycling programs.
- 5. The Licencee shall not emit particulate matter from Development such that:
 - a. particulate matter:
 - i. exceeds 0.23 grams per dry canoard cub, metre calculated at 25 degrees Celsius and 760 millimetres of mercury corrected to 12 percent carbon dioxide for processes involving combustion from any point source of the Development;
 - ii. exhibits a visible plume with an opacit of greater than 5 percent at any point beyond the property line of the Development, or
 - iii. results in the deposition of the particulate residue at any time beyond the property line of the Development; or
 - b. opacity from my point source the Development equals or exceeds:
 - i. 20 perceives the average of any 24 consecutive opacity observations taken at 15 second intervals;

1. 20 p cent for hore than 16 individual opacity observations within any 1 hour period; or 40 period. The any individual opacity observation.

- 6. The Licencee call not cause or permit a noise nuisance to be created as a result of the operation of the Development, and shall take such steps as the Director may require to eliminate or mitigate a noise nuisance.
- 7. The Licencee shall at the request of the Director, conduct soil, air (stack and/or ambient), ground water, surface water or noise monitoring at or adjacent to the Development.
- 8. The Licencee shall, unless otherwise specified in this Licence, ensure that all analytical determinations are undertaken by an accredited laboratory for any of the following analytes as may be specified by the Director:
 - a. Pesticides; and
 - b. Particulate Matter (in air).

9. The Licencee shall submit a copy of the sampling report complete with analytical results as specified pursuant to Clauses 7 and 8 of this Licence, to the Director within 60 days of the completion of the sampling program.

SPECIFICATIONS, LIMITS, TERMS AND CONDITIONS

I - LIQUID EMISSIONS

- 10. The Licencee shall not direct any spillage, contaminated run-off or pollutant, other than sewage, to an approved sewage disposal system.
- 11. The Licencee shall contain and clean up immediately any chemical spills in order to prevent soil, surface water or ground water contamination.
- 12. The Licencee shall ensure that the site retention area is protected with a minimum or cm of compacted clay material or other materials approved by the Director.
- 13. The Licencee shall ensure that the Development is adequately diked and the mechanical art of culverts are installed at the low end of the diked area and those control culverts remain in the closed position. The Regional Office of Manitoba Conservation in Steinbach shall be contacted for prior approval to get the control culverts to permit land drainage.
- 14. The Licencee shall ensure that the surface of the site retention to a is inspected semiannually for desiccation cracks, and that the site retention area's continuity is maintained.

II - REMEDIAL ACT.

15. The Licencee, subject to obtaining approval from an Environment Officer, shall immediately dispose of any contaminated material in accordance with the approval.

III - EMV RGENCY CO. VINGENCY PLAN

16. The Licencee shall submit, within ninet, (90) days of the issuance of this Licence, an emergency response contingency plan to be approver by the Deletor of his plan shall include, but not be limited to, items which will address: measures implement d for spill prevention and containment; security; personnel training; fire and other response arrangements.

IV - PESTICIDES

- 17. The Licencee shall construct and naintain the concrete floors and curbs of all pesticide storage structure(s) so as to prevent state liquit from caking into the soil.
- 18. The Licencee shall mate and maintain a current duplicate inventory of all pesticides stored at the Development, with one constored at the premises of the Development, and the other copy stored at a location off-site from the Development.
- 19. The Licencee shall store only pesticides registered under the Pest Control Products Act of Canada at the Development.
- 20. The Licencee shall contain on the Development:
 - a. any on-site pesticide spill;
 - b. waste water generated from any response action due to an on-site release of pesticides; and
 - c. contaminated water resulting from the extinguishing of any fire involving pesticides.
- 21. The Licencee shall locate the pesticide storage structure(s) a minimum distance of:

- a. 100 metres from any property zoned residential; and
- b. 100 metres from single residences

unless a written consent form is obtained from the owner(s).

V - SITE DECOMMISSIONING

- 22. The Licencee shall submit within one (1) year prior to closure of the facility, for the approval of the Director, a formal detailed Decommissioning Plan for the facility.
- 23. The Licencee shall implement, on closure of the facility, the approved Decommissioning Plan.

REVIEW AND REVOCATION

- A. If, in the opinion of the Director, the Licencee has exceeded or is exceeding or has one failing to meet the specifications, limits, terms, or conditions set out in this Licence, the Director may, ten, prarile or permanently, revoke this Licence.
- B. If construction of the development is not commenced within three years of the date of this Licence, the Licence is revoked.
- C. If, in the opinion of the Director, new evidence warrants a change in the specifications, limits, terms, or conditions of this Licence, the Director may require the fills of a two processal pursuant to Section 10 of The Environment Act.
