#### THIS LICENCE IS ISSUED TO:

### The Local Government District of Park: "the Licencee"

for the construction and operation of the Development being a low level crossing on the Minnedosa River (Little Saskatchewan River) in NE 36-19-21W in the Local Government District of Park, subject to the following specifications, limits, terms and conditions:

## Specifications. Limits. Terms and Conditions

- 1. The Licencee shall construct and operate the Development in accordance with the Environment Act Proposal dated October 15, 1993 and a supplementary letter dated April 21, 1994 and addressed to Manitoba Environment.
- 2. The Licencee shall not undertake instream construction activities associated with the Development between April 1 and June 15 of any year.
- 3. The Licencee shall ensure that the Development is constructed in accordance with the Manitoba Natural Resources publication Recommended Fish Protection Procedures for Stream Crossings in Manitoba.
- 4. The Licencee shall contact the Regional Fisheries Manager of Manitoba Natural Resources advising of the anticipated construction schedule for the Development at least two weeks before beginning construction.
- 5. The Licencee shall take appropriate measures during the construction of the Development to ensure that exposed soil does not enter the Minnedosa River as a result of construction activities or subsequent erosion.
- 6. The Licencee shall stabilize the sideslopes of the approaches to the crossing with riprap to prevent erosion by high velocity flows.
- 7. The Licencee shall revegetate soil exposed during the construction of the Development with native or introduced grasses or legumes.
- 8. The Licencee shall ensure that debris is removed from the crossing as required to prevent excessive ponding of water. In particular, the low flow culvert shall be kept open and operable at all times to allow fish passage.

- 9. The Licencee shall ensure that all waste oil products generated by the machinery used in the construction and operation of the Development are collected and disposed of in accordance with applicable Manitoba Environment and legislative requirements.
- 10. The Licencee shall ensure that fuel storage areas established for the construction and operation of the Development shall comply with the requirements of Manitoba Regulation 97/88R respecting Storage and Handling of Gasoline and Associated Products.

#### **REVOCATION**

If, in the opinion of the Director, the Licencee has exceeded or is exceeding the limits, or has not complied or is not complying with the specifications, terms or conditions set out herein, the Director may revoke this Licence either temporarily or permanently.
