THIS LICENCE IS ISSUED TO:

THE PROVINCE OF MANITOBA REPRESENTED BY THE MINISTER OF HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION: The "Licencee"

for the construction, operation, and maintenance of the Development being the upgrading of Provincial Road #354 from 0.8 km. west of the Lake Audy Road to Provincial Road #250 in the Local Government District of Park subject to the following specifications, terms and conditions:

SPECIFICATIONS, LIMITS, TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. The Licencee shall construct the Development in accordance with the Environment Act Proposal of the Proposed Upgrading of Provincial Road #354 in the L.G. D. of Park (from 0.8 km. west of the Lake Audy Road to PR #250), dated May 25, 1994.
- The Licencee shall, during construction, adhere to the general recommendations on design, construction and maintenance of stream crossings as specified in the Manitoba Department of Natural Resources guidelines titled Recommended Fish Protection Procedures for Stream Crossings in Manitoba.
- 3. The Licencee shall, prior to beginning construction on the Wasamin stream crossing, consult and reach an agreement with the Manitoba Department of Natural Resources Regional Fisheries Biologist regarding the type and method of construction of the Wasamin Creek temporary crossing.
- 4. The Licencee shall, during construction of the Development, remove any temporary culvert crossing on Wasamin Creek prior to spring breakup.
- 5. The Licencee shall, from spring breakup to June 15 of each year during construction, cease all construction activities that may impact upon the stream channel and which may affect fish mobility and fish habitat.

6. The Licencee shall, during construction, ensure that all fuel storage areas established for the construction of the Development are located a minimum distance of 100 meters away from all lakes and streams, and shall comply with the requirements of Manitoba Regulation 97/88R respecting Storage and Handling of Gasoline and Associated Products Regulation.

REVOCATION

If in the opinion of the Director the Licencee has exceeded or is exceeding the limits, or has not complied or is not complying with the specifications, terms or conditions set out herein, the Director may revoke, temporarily or permanently, this Licence.
