AN ORDER OF THE CLEAN ENVIRONMENT COMMISSION



UNDER THE CLEAN ENVIRONMENT ACT

Re: The Clean Environment Commission and Mr. Wilfred Carriere, applicant,

WHEREAS pursuant to the provisions of The Clean Environment Act,
Mr. Wilfred Carriere, Box 264, St. Pierre has submitted an
application to the Clean Environment Commission to prescribe
limits in connection with the operation of a hog barn located
on River Lot 17 of the Rat River Settlement, Township 6
Range 4 East in the Rural Municipality of De Salaberry,

AND WHEREAS representation was made to the Clean Environment Commission by a person who is or is likely to be affected by an Order of the Commission prescribing limits in connection with the said operation,

AND WHEREAS the Clean Environment Commission held a public hearing on the 13th day of November, 1972 in the Council Chambers at Steinbach, Manitoba,

AND WHEREAS the Clean Environment Commission considered the application to prescribe limits on the 13th day of November, 1972, on the 24th of April, 1973 and on the 14th of May, 1973,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT

- 1. The applicant shall ensure that within three years of the date of issuance of this Order there is no deposit, discharge or emission of contaminants from any part of the said operation located on River Lot 17, Rat River Settlement west of the municipal road passing through the said property that connect St. Pierre and Otterburne,
- 2. The applicant shall ensure that during the said three year period from the date of issuance of this Order:
 - (1) new deposits of livestock wastes are removed at least twice yearly and disposed of in accordance with the prescribed manner for agricultural purposes,
 - (2) existing accumulations of livestock wastes are gradually and systematically removed and disposed of in the prescribed manner for agricultural purposes,
- 3. The applicant shall ensure that, with respect to that part of the said operation carried out on River Lot 17, Rat River Settlement east of the said municipal road and west of Provincial Highway No. 59:

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3. continued

- (1) all waste from the said operation shall be disposed of in accordance with the prescribed manner for agricultural purposes,
- (2) structures or storages for livestock waste, including manure piles and holding ponds, shall be constructed and maintained so as to:
 - i. retain the waste on land under the control of the operator; and,
 - ii. prevent the waste from entering any body of water,
- (3) all dead livestock from the said operation shall be:
 - i. rendered in a rendering plant; or,
 - ii. buried with a minimum of three feet earthen cover; or,
 - iii. disposed of in some other manner approved by the Minister,
- (4) no spillage or leakage occurs from any vehicle used to transport livestock waste on public roads or right of ways,
- (5) all future buildings relative to the said operation are located not closer than:
 - 35 feet from the south boundary of the applicant's property, and
 - ii. 200 feet from the east limit of the said municipal road right-of-way, and
 - iii. 200 feet from the north boundary of the applicant's property, and
 - iv. 600 feet from the west limit of the right-of-way of Provincial Highway No. 59,
- (6) the maximum number of livestock on the premises at any one time does not exceed 600.

* "Prescribed manner for agricultural purposes" means the manner whereby livestock waste is applied onto or introduced into soil from which a crop is grown within sixteen months from the time of application or introduction and from which a crop is harvested within thirty months from the time of application or introduction.
