Receipt of the July 26, 2013 letter and associated documentation from GED/IVAR INC. on behalf of the Rural Municipality (RM) of Ritchot regarding the Village of Ile Des Chene Wastewater Treatment Lagoon - Environment Act Licence No. 2577 R is acknowledged as a Norce of Alteration (NoA) in accordance with Section 14 of *The Environment Act*.

The requested change to the Development as Licenced is to more the construction of the proposed secondary cell from SE 32-8-4 EPM to NE 29-8-4 EPM. The reasonale for the proposed change was identified as follows:

- The land originally proposed for lagoen expansion has been repurposed for the further development of the existing waste disport she and
- The need remains to expand the existing lagoon for the growing population in the community.

The potential environmental effects of the requested change(s) are considered to be minor. Accordingly, the request as indicated in the July 26, 2013 Litter is approved as a minor alteration in accordance with section 14(2) of *The Environment Act* repiect to the following conditions:

- 1. The Licencee shall prive to commencing construction, submit to the Director a copy of Certificate of fatle stowing the owner(s) and legal description of the land upon which the proposed secondary cell will be constructed;
- 2. The Licencee shall, rior to commencing construction, submit to the Director a letter indicating there are no concerns respecting heritage resources from the Historic Resources Branch of Manitoba Conservation and Water Stewardship; and
- 3. The Licencee shall, prior to commencing construction, submit to the Director a listing of rare species for the proposed location from the Manitoba Conservation Data Centre.

for the construction, operation and maint mance of the Development being an expanded wastewater treatment lagoon located on SE 32-8-4 and NE 9-8-4 EPM in the Rural Municipality of Ritchot. The proposed development consists of the expansion of the secondary cell of the Village of Ile Des Chenes wastewater stabilization pour to send the anticipated increase in population in the village. Treated wastewater will be discharged into the existing discharge route, which runs into the Seine River trains into the Red River, in accordance with the Proposal filed under *The* Diversion and ultimately Environment Act on Februar, 22, 2011, and the Notice of Alteration submitted on July 29, 2013 and subject to the following specifications, limits, terms and conditions:

DEFINITIONS

In this Licence,

"accredited laboratory" means an analytical facility accredited by the Standard Council of Canada (SCC), or accredited by another accrediting agency recognized by Manitoba Conservation to be equivalent to the SCC, or be able to demonstrate, upon request, that it has the quality assurance/quality control (QA/QC) procedures in place equivalent to accreditation based on the international standard ISO/IEC 17025, or otherwise approved by the Director;

"affected area" means a geographical area, excluding the property of the Development;

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"approved" means approved by the Director, or an assigned Environment Officer, in writing;

"ASTM" means the American Society for Testing and Materials;

"base" means the exposed and finished elevation of the bottom of any cell of the wastewater treatment lagoon;

"bentonite" means specially formulated standard mill grade sodium bentonite conforming to American Petroleum Institute Specification 13-A;

"Director" means an employee so designated pursuant to *The Environment Act*;

"effluent" means treated wastewater flowing or pumped out of the wastewater treatment lagoon;

"Environment Officer" means an employee so appointed pursuant to the Environment Act;

"**fecal coliform**" means aerobic and facultative, Gram-negative, conspore-forming, rod-shaped bacteria capable of growth at 44.5 °C, and associated with fecal matter of v arm-blooded animals;

"**five-day biochemical oxygen demand**" means that part of the oxygen demand usually associated with biochemical oxidation of organic matter within 5 day, at a temperature of 20°C;

"five-day carbonaceous biochemical oxygen demand" means that part of the oxygen demand usually associated with biochemical oxidation of corbonaceous organic matter within five days at a temperature of 20°C, excluding the oxygen demand usually associated with the biochemical oxidation of nitrogenous organic matter;

"flooding" means the howing of unter onto lands, other than waterways, due to the overtopping of a waterway or waterways;

"grab sample" means a quantity of wastewater taken at a given place and time;

"high water mark" means the line on the interior surface of the facultative and storage cells which is normally reached when the cell is at the maximum allowable liquid level or the line of the exterior of the perimeter dykes which is reached during local flooding;

"**hydraulic conductivity**" means the quantity of water that will flow through a unit cross-sectional area of a porous material per unit of time under a hydraulic gradient of 1.0;

"industrial wastewater" means wastewater derived from an industry which manufactures, handles or processes a product and does not include wastewater from commercial and residential buildings;

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"low water mark" means the line on the interior surface of the facultative and storage cells which is normally reached when the cell is discharged;

"MPN Index" means the most probable number of coliform organisms in a given volume of wastewater which, in accordance with statistical theory, would yield the observed test result with the greatest frequency;

"odour nuisance" means a continuous or repeated odour, smell or aroma, in an affected area, which is offensive, obnoxious, troublesome, annoying, unpleasant, or disagreeable to a person:

- a) residing in an affected area;
- b) working in an affected area; or

c) present at a location in an affected area which is normally open to members of the public; if the odour, smell or aroma

- If the oddur, smell of aroma d, is the subject of at least 5 wr
 - d) is the subject of at least 5 written complaints, received by the Director in a form satisfactory to the Director and within a 90-day period, from 5 different persons falling within clauses a),
 b) or c), who do not live in the same household; or
 - e) is the subject of at least one written complant, received by the Director in a form satisfactory to the Director, from a person falling with a clauses a), b) or c) and the Director is of the opinion that if the odour, smell or arotna had occurred in a more densely populated area there would have been at least 5 written complaints received within a 90-day period, from 5 different persons who do not live in the same household;

"**primary cell**" means the first in a series of cells of the wastewater treatment lagoon system and which is the cell that receives the untreated wastewater;

"record drawings" means engineering drawings complete with all dimensions which indicate all features of the Development as it has actually been built;

"**riprap**" means small, basken stones or boulders placed compactly or irregularly on dykes or similar embankments for protection of earth surfaces against wave action or current;

"secondary cell" means a cell of the wastewater treatment lagoon system which is the cell that receives partially treated wastewater from the primary cell;

"**septage**" means the sludge produced in individual on-site wastewater disposal systems such as septic tanks;

"sewage" means household and commercial wastewater that contains human waste;

"sludge" means accumulated solid material containing large amounts of entrained water, which has separated from wastewater during processing;

"Standard Methods for the Examination of Water and Wastewater" means the most recent edition of Standard Methods for the Examination of Water and Wastewater published jointly by the American

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Public Health Association, the American Waterworks Association and the Water Environment Federation;

"total coliform" means a group of aerobic and facultative anaerobic, Gram-negative, nonsporeforming, rod-shaped bacteria, that ferment lactose with gas and acid formation within 48 hours at 35 °C, and inhabit predominantly the intestines of man or animals, but are occasionally found elsewhere and include the sub-group of fecal coliform bacteria;

"wastewater" means the spent or used water of a community or industry which contains dissolved and suspended matter;

"wastewater collection system" means the sewer and pumping system used for the collection and conveyance of domestic, commercial and industrial wastewater; and

"wastewater treatment lagoon" means the component of the development which consists of an impoundment into which wastewater is discharged for treatment and storage.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

This Section of the Licence contains requirements intended to provide guidance to the Licencee in implementing practices to ensure that the environment is maintained in such a manner as to sustain a high quality of life, including social and economic development, recreation and leisure for present and future Manitobans.

- 1. The Licencee shall direct all wastewater generated within the unincorporated Village of Ile Des Chenes toward the wastewater treatment lagoon or other approved sewage treatment facilities.
- 2. In addition to any cine limits, terms and conditions specified in this Licence, the Licence shall, upon the request of the Director:
 - a) sample, monitor, analyze and/or investigate specific areas of concern regarding any segment, component or aspect of pollutant storage, containment, treatment, handling, disposal or emission systems, for such pollutants or ambient quality, aquatic toxicity, leachate characteristics and discharge or emission rates, for such duration and at such frequencies as may be specified;
 - b) determine the environmental impact associated with the release of any pollutant(s) from the Development; or
 - c) provide the Director, within such time as may be specified, with such reports, drawings, specifications, analytical data, descriptions of sampling and analytical procedures being used, bioassay data, flow rate measurements and such other information as may from time to time be requested.

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- 3. The Licencee shall submit all information required to be provided to the Director under this Licence, in writing, in such form (including number of copies) and of such content as may be required by the Director or Environment Officer, and each submission shall be clearly labelled with the Licence Number and Client File Number associated with this Licence.
- 4. The Licencee shall, in the case of physical or mechanical equipment breakdown or process upset where such breakdown or process upset results or may result in the release of a pollutant in an amount or concentration, or at a level or rate of release, that causes or may cause a significant adverse effect, immediately report the event by calling 204-944-4888 (toll-free 1-855-944-4888). The report shall indicate the nature of the event, the time and estimated duration of the event and the reason for the event.
- 5. The Licencee shall, following the reporting of an event pursuant of Clarse 4,
 - a) identify the repairs required to the mechanical equipment
 - b) undertake all repairs to minimize unauthorized discharges is pollutant;
 - c) complete the repairs in accordance with any written instructions of the Director; and
 - d) submit a report to the Director about the cause of breakdown and measures taken, within one week of the repairs being done.
- 6. The Licencee shall comply with the provision of the *Manitoba Regulation 331/88R* respecting *Water Works, Sewerage and Sewage Dispecal Regulation* and its amendment or any future amendment thereof.
- 7. The Licencee shall comply with the provisions of the Department of Fisheries and Oceans Canada/Manitoba Natural Resources prolication, "*Manitoba Stream Crossing Guidelines for the Protection of Fish and Fish He Itat*" (May, 1996).
- 8. The Licencee shou obtain and maintain classification of the Development pursuant to *Manitoba Regulation* 77/2003 respecting *Water and Wastewater Facility Operators* or any future amendment thereof and maintain compliance with all requirements of the regulation including, but not limited to, the preparation and maintenance of a Table of Organization, Emergency Response Plan and Standard Operating Procedures.
- 9. The Licencee shall carry out the operation of the Development with individuals properly certified to do so pursuant to *Manitoba Regulation* 77/2003 respecting *Water and Wastewater Facility Operators* or any future amendment thereof.
- 10. The Licencee shall obtain all necessary federal, provincial and/or municipal licences, authorizations, permits and/or approvals for construction of relevant components of the Development prior to commencement of construction.

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- 11. The Licencee shall not cause or permit an odour nuisance to be created as a result of the construction, operation or alteration of the Development, and shall take such steps as the Director may require to eliminate or to mitigate an odour nuisance.
- 12. The Licencee shall actively participate in any current or future watershed-based management study, plan and/or nutrient reduction program, approved by the Director, for Seine River Diversion, the Red River and associated waterways and watersheds.
- 13. The Licencee shall, prior to construction, obtain a permit from Manitoba Infrastructure and Transportation to install a pipe under the Seine River Diversion.
- 14. The Licencee shall submit to the Director, prior to construction, a letter indicating there are no concerns respecting heritage resources from the Historic Resources Branch of Manitoba Conservation and Water Stewardship.
- 15. The Licencee shall submit to the Director, prior to construction a listing of rare species for the proposed development from the Manitoba Conservation Data Centre.

SPECIFICATIONS, LIMITS, TERMSAND CONDITIONS

Respecting Construction – General

- 16. The Licencee shall notify the a signed Environment Officer not less than two weeks prior to beginning construction of the Development. The notification shall include the intended starting date of construction, the name of the contractor responsible for the construction and the name of the on-site contact person.
- 17. The Licencee shall
 - a) conduct all ditch related work activities during no flow or dry conditions and not during the April 1 to June 15 hish spawning and incubation period;
 - b) not construct the wastewater treatment lagoon or wastewater collection system during periods of heavy rain;
 - c) place and/or isolate all dredged and construction materials where it will not erode into any watercourse;
 - d) implement long-term sediment and erosion control measures to prevent soil-laden runoff, and/or silt from entering any watercourse during construction and until vegetation is established;
 - e) routinely inspect all erosion and sediment control structures and immediately complete any necessary maintenance or repair;
 - vegetate any disturbed areas by planting and seeding preferably native trees, shrubs or grasses and cover such areas with mulch to prevent soil erosion and to help seeds germinate; and
 - g) use rock that is free of silt and clay for rip rap.

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- 18. The Licencee shall install and maintain a fence around the wastewater treatment lagoon to limit access. The fence shall be a minimum of 1.2 meters high and have a locking gate, which shall be locked at all times except to allow access to the wastewater treatment lagoon.
- 19. The Licencee shall locate all fuel storage and equipment servicing areas established for the construction and operation of the Development a minimum distance of 100 metres from any waterbody, and shall comply with the requirements of *Manitoba Regulation 188/2001* respecting *Storage and Handling of Petroleum Products and Allied Products Regulation* or any future amendment thereof.
- 20. The Licencee shall, during construction of the wastewater treatment lagoon, operate, maintain and store all materials and equipment in a manner that prevents an deleterious substances (fuel, oil, grease, hydraulic fluids, coolant, paint, uncured concrete and concrete wash water, etc.) from entering the wastewater treatment lagoon, the discharge route and associated watercourses, and have an emergency spill kit for in water use available on-site during construction.
- 21. The Licencee shall:
 - a) prepare updated "record drawings" for the Development and shall label the drawings "Record Drawings"; and
 - b) provide to the Director, not later than six months after construction of the development is completed, two sets of "record drawings" of the wastewater treatment lagoon.

Respecting Construction – Liner

- 22. The Licencee shall, prior to the construction of the dykes for the wastewater treatment lagoon:
 - a) remove all organic top oil from the area where the dykes will be constructed; or
 - b) remove all organic matural for a depth of 0.3 metres and a width of 3.0 metres from the area where the lin a will be constructed.
- 23. The Licencee shall construct and maintain all cells of the wastewater treatment lagoon with continuous liners, including cut-offs, under all interior surfaces of the cells in accordance with the following specifications:
 - a) the liners shall be made of clay;
 - b) the liners shall be at least one metre in thickness;
 - c) the liners shall have a hydraulic conductivity of 1×10^{-7} centimetres per second or less at all locations; and
 - d) the liners shall be constructed to an elevation of 2.5 metres above the base of each cell.
- 24. The Licencee shall arrange with the designated Environment Officer a mutually acceptable time and date for any required soil sampling between the 15th day of May and the 15th day of October of any year, unless otherwise approved by the designated Environment Officer.

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- 25. The Licencee shall take and test undisturbed soil samples, in accordance with Schedule "A" attached to this Licence, from the liners of the cells of the wastewater treatment lagoon; the number and location of samples and test methods are to be specified the designated Environment Officer up to a maximum of 30 samples.
- 26. The Licencee shall, not less than two weeks before the wastewater treatment lagoon is placed in operation, submit for the approval of the Environment Officer the results of the tests carried out pursuant to Clause 25 of this Licence.

Respecting Operation

- 27. The Licencee shall operate and maintain the wastewater treatment beyon in such a manner that:
 - a) the organic loading on the wastewater treatment lagoon, in terms of the five-day biochemical oxygen demand, is not in excess of 56 kilograms per hectare per day;
 - b) the depth of liquid in the cells does not exceed 1.5 met es;
 - c) a 1.0 metre freeboard is maintained in primary and secondary cells at all times.
- 28. The Licencee shall not discharge, or permit discharge of, leptage into the wastewater treatment lagoon. The Licencee shall erect and maintain information signs, acceptable to the Director, indicating that septage may not be discharged at the facility and directing septage haulers to an appropriate facility.
- 29. The Licencee shall construct and maintain an all-weather access road to the wastewater treatment lagoon.
- 30. The Licencee shall not discharge effluent from the wastewater treatment lagoon:
 - a) where the organic content of the effluent, as indicated by the five day biochemical oxygen demand, is in excess of 25 milligrams per litre;
 - b) where the fect confirmment of the effluent, as indicated by the MPN index, is in excess of 200 per 100 multilitres of sample;
 - c) where the total conform content of the effluent, as indicated by the MPN index, is in excess of 1500 per 100 millilitres of sample;
 - d) where the total suspended solids content of the effluent is in excess of 25 milligrams per litre, unless the exceedance is caused by algae;
 - e) where the total phosphorus is in excess of 1.0 milligram per litre;
 - f) between the 1st day of November of any year and the 15th day of June of the following year;
 - g) when flooding from any cause is occurring along the effluent drainage route; or
 - h) when such a discharge would cause or contribute to flooding in or along the effluent drainage route.
- 31. The Licencee shall discharge the wastewater treatment lagoon over at least a two-week period, while accelerating discharge as necessary to maintain normal operation of the wastewater treatment lagoon, such that increased nutrient uptake from the wastewater effluent may occur along the discharge route.

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Respecting Maintenance

- 32. The Licencee shall, if, in the opinion of the Director, significant erosion of the interior surfaces of the dykes occurs, repair the dyke and install riprap as necessary. The riprap shall be placed on the interior dyke surfaces from 0.6 metres above the high water mark to at least 0.6 metres below the low water mark to protect the dykes from wave action.
- 33. The Licencee shall provide and maintain a grass cover on the dykes of the wastewater treatment lagoon and shall regulate the growth of the vegetation so that the height of the vegetation does not exceed 0.3 metres on all dykes.
- 34. The Licencee shall annually remove by mechanical methods all reds, rushes and trees located above the low water mark in every cell of the wastewater treatment lagoon.
- 35. The Licencee shall implement an ongoing program to rem arrowing animals from the site of ve) the wastewater treatment lagoon.

MONITORING AND REPORTING

- The Licencee shall, unless otherwise specific in this Licence: 36.
 - a) carry out all preservations and an isses on liquid samples in accordance with the methods prescribed in "Standard Methods for the Examination of Water and Wastewater" or in accordance with an equivalent analytical methodology approved by the Director;b) have all analytical determinations undertaken by an accredited laboratory; and

 - c) report the results to the Director, in writing or in a format acceptable to the Director, within 60 days of the le be ken. ing t
- 37. The Licencee shall prior to each effluent discharge campaign, obtain grab samples of the treated wastewater and have them analyzed for:
 - a) the organic content as indicated by the five-day biochemical oxygen demand and expressed as milligrams per litre;
 - b) the organic content as indicated by the five-day carbonaceous biochemical oxygen demand and expressed as milligrams per litre;
 - c) the fecal coliform content as indicated by the MPN index and expressed as MPN per 100 millilitres per sample;
 - d) the total coliform content as indicated by the MPN index and expressed as MPN per 100 millilitres per sample;
 - e) the total suspended solids content expressed as milligrams per litre; and
 - f) the total phosphorus content expressed as milligram per litre.
- 38. The Licencee shall, when chlorine is used as a disinfecting agent:
 - a) notify the Director in advance;
 - b) dechlorinate effluent prior to discharge;

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- c) obtain daily grab samples during the discharge period and have them analyzed for total residual chlorine; and
- d) not discharge effluent where the concentration of the total residual chlorine is in excess of 0.02 mg/L.
- 39. The Licencee shall:
 - a) during each year maintain records of:
 - i) reports of visual inspections conducted at a minimum of once per month;
 - ii) wastewater sample dates;

iii) original copies of laboratory analytical results of the sampled wastewater; and iv) effluent discharge dates;

- b) make the records being maintained pursuant to sub-Clause 39 b) of this Licence available to an Environment Officer upon request; and
- c) keep the maintained records of any one calendar year available for inspection for a period of three years following the respective calendar year in which ney were recorded.
- 40. The Licencee shall immediately notify the Director each ime the operating depth of any cell of the wastewater treatment lagoon exceeds the maximum operating depth for that cell as specified in this Licence.
- 41. The Licencee shall, if reporting is required pursuant to Clause 40 of this Licence in two consecutive years:
 - a) engage the services of a qualified consultant, acceptable to the Director, to undertake an investigation of the Facility and related infrastructure, to determine the ability or inability of the existing system to meet the hydraulic loading capacity of the Rural Municipality of Rockwood. The investigation shall include but not be necessarily limited to:
 - i) diagnosis of the cauce(s) of the recent exceedances of maximum operating depth;
 - ii) sources a infibration into the wastewater system including the municipal infrastructure;
 - iii) current hydraulic loading of the system;
 - iv) lack of storage capacity due to sludge build-up within existing cells; and
 - v) the organic loading on the primary cell in terms of the five day biochemical oxygen demand;
 - b) provide to the Director, within four months of the notification given pursuant to Clause 40 of this Licence, an engineering report describing in detail the results and observations concluded by virtue of the investigation; and
 - c) provide to the Director, within four months of the report provided pursuant to sub-Clause b) of this section, a remedial action plan in the form of a detailed engineering report describing recommended modifications, repairs or upgrading works to overcome excessive hydraulic loading of the system.
- 42. The Licencee shall, during the first year of operation of the Development following the construction of the wastewater treatment lagoon that a discharge must occur, obtain and analyze grab samples of the effluent during each effluent discharge campaign and report the results of the analysis in accordance with Schedule "B" attached to this Licence.

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REVIEW AND REVOCATION

- A. Environment Act Licence No. 2577 R is hereby rescinded.
- B. Environment Act Licence No. 2577 is hereby rescinded upon commissioning of the expanded wastewater treatment lagoon.
- C. If, in the opinion of the Director, the Licencee has exceeded or is exceeding or has or is failing to meet the specifications, limits, terms, or conditions set out in this Licence, the Director may, temporarily or permanently, revoke this Licence.
- D. If, in the opinion of the Director, new evidence warrants a change to the specifications, limits, terms or conditions of this Licence, the Director may require the fling of a new proposal pursuant to Section 11 of *The Environment Act*.

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Schedule "A" to Environment Act Licence No. 2577 RR

Liner sampling and testing requirements pursuant to Clause # 25

Soil Sampling:

- 1. The Licencee shall provide a drilling rig, acceptable to the designated Environment Officer, to extract soil samples from the liner which is not placed or found at the surface of the lagoon structure. This includes all wastewater treatment lagoons constructed with clay cutoffs at the interior base of the dyke or with a clay cutoff in the centre of the dyke. The drill rig shall have the capacity to drill to the maximum depth of the clay cutoff plus an additional 2 metres. The drill rig shall be equipped with both standard and hollow stem augers. The minimum hole diameter shall be 5 inches.
- 2. For lagoon liners placed or found at the surface of the lagoon structure, the Licencee shall provide a machine, acceptable to the designated Environment Officer, capable of pressing a sampling tube into the liner in a straight line motion along the centre axis line of the sample tube and without sideways movement.
- 3. Soil samples shall be collected and shipped in accordance with ASTM Standard D 1587 (Standard Practice for Thin-Walles Tube Sampling of Soils), D 4220 (Standard Practice for Preserving and Fransporting Soil Samples) and D 3550 (Standard Practice for Ring-Lines Barel Sampling of Soils). Thin-walled tubes shall meet the stated requirements including length, inside clearance ratio and corrosion protection. An adequate vonting area shall be provided through the sampling head.
- 4. At the time of sample correction, the designated Environment Officer shall advise the Licencee is to the soil esting method that must be used on each sample. The oedometer method may be used for a sample were the Environment Officer determines to the soil sample is taken from an undisturbed clay soil which has not been remoulded and which is homogeneous and unweathered. The triaxial test shall be used for all samples taken from disturbed and remoulded soils or from non homogenous and weathered soils. The rigid-wall, compaction-mold permeameter test shall be used on soil-bentonite mixtures that have elevated moisture contents and that cannot be sampled without the use of additional containment devices.
- 5. The Licencee shall provide a report on the collection of soil samples to the designated Environment Officer and to the laboratory technician which includes but is not limited to the following: a plot plan indicating all drill holes, onsite visual observations, sample location, depth or elevation of sample, length of advance of the sample tube, length of soil sample contained in the tube after its advancement, the soil test method specified by the Environment Officer for each soil sample and all necessary instructions from the site engineer to the laboratory technician.
- 6. All drill and sample holes shall be sealed with bentonite pellets after the field drilling and sampling has been completed.

Soil Testing Methods:

- 1. Triaxial Test Method
 - a) The soil samples shall be tested for hydraulic conductivity using ASTM D 5084 (Standard Test Method for Measurement of Hydraulic Conductivity of Saturated Porous Materials Using a Flexible Wall Permeameter).
 - b) Soil specimens shall have a minimum diameter of 70 mm (2.75 inches) and a minimum height of 70 mm (2.75 inches). The soil specimens shall be selected from a section of the soil sample which contains the most porous material based on a visual inspection. The hydraulic gradient shall not exceed 30 during sample preparation and testing. Swelling of the soil specimen should be controlled to adjust for the amount of compaction measured during sample collection and extraction from the tube and the depth or elevation of the sample. The effective stress used during saturation or consolidation of the sample shall not exceed 40 kPa (5.7 psi) or the specine stress level, that is expected in the field location were the sample was taken, which ever is greater.
 - c) The complete laboratory report, as outlined in ASTM 15086, shall be supplied for each soil sample collected in the field.
- 2. Oedometer Test Method
 - a) The soil samples shall be tested for hydraulic conductivity using ASTM D 2435 (Standard Test Memod for One-Dimensional Consolidation Properties of Soils).
 - b) Soil specimens shall have a minipum diameter of 50 mm (2 inches) and a minimum height of 20 mm (0.8 inches). The soil specimens shall be selected from a section of the soil simple which contains the most porous material based on a visual inspection. The soil specimen shall be taken from an undisturbed soil sample. The soil specimen shall be completely saturated.
 - c) The complete laboratory report, as outlined in ASTM D 2435, shall be supplied for each concerning collected in the field.

Schedule "B" to Environment Act Licence No. 2577 RR

Initial Characterization of Wastewater pursuant to Clause # 42

Facility Size: Very small (less than $500 \text{ m}^3/\text{day}$)

Facility Type: Facultative wastewater treatment lagoon - intermittent discharge

Effluent Sampling:

During the first year of operation, for all discharge events:

- 1. Obtain a representative grab sample of the discharging effluent near the beginning of the discharge period and near the end of the discharge period (i.e., two samples for each discharge event.)
- 2. Determine the temperature of each sample at the time of sampling.

Effluent Analysis:

- 1. For each grab sample, have the grab sample analysed for:
 - a) the organic content as indicated by the rive day biochemical oxygen demand and expressed as milligrams per litter
 - b) the organic content as indicated by the five day carbonaceous biochemical oxygen demand and expressed as milligram per litre;
 - c) the total suspended solids content expressed as milligrams per litre;
 - d) the *Escherichia coli* (*E. Coli*) content is indicated by the MPN index and expressed as MPN per 100 millions per sample;
 - e) the fecal coliform content as indepated by the MPN index and expressed as MPN per 100 millilitres per sample;
 - f) the total coliform content as indicated by the MPN index and expressed as MPN per 100 millimester sample;
 - g) if chlorine was used as a disinfecting agent, total residual chlorine expressed as malligrams per litre;
 - h) total amrionia mirogen expressed as milligrams per litre;
 - i) nitrate nitrate nitrogen expressed as milligrams per litre;
 - j) total Nieldahl nitrogen (TKN) expressed as milligrams per litre;
 - k) dissolved phosphorus expressed as milligrams per litre;
 - 1) total phosphorus expressed as milligrams per litre; and
 - m) pH.

Effluent Reporting:

1. For each grab sample, report the results to the Director, in writing or in an electronic format acceptable to the Director within 60 days of the sampling date. The report shall include the sampling date, sample temperature, the dates of the effluent discharge, and copies of the laboratory analytical results of the sampled effluent.
