








Environmental Assessment Process

- Environmental Assessment report will be prepared for provincial review.
- Environment Act Licence required before construction can commence.



Project Description

- Proposed Tailings Management Area (TMA) expansion.
 - New main pond and new polishing pond on 98 ha of land.
 - Sized to accommodate 10-yrs of operation at a future milling rate of 2,500 sdtpd.
 - Storage capacity:
 - 6,485,000 m³ of tailings in main pond.
 - 1,045,000 m³ of water in polishing pond.
 - Construction of 3 new access roads.











Project Location







Existing Tailings Management Area




- Water within main pond pumped into polishing pond twice a year for treatment.
- Treated water within polishing pond pumped into No Name Creek during annual fall discharge campaign.









Proposed Tailings Management Area Expansion



- Sized to meet future milling rate of 2,500 sdtpd for the Rice Lake Gold Mine.
- Includes a main pond (store tailings) and a polishing pond (treat water waste).
- Vegetation removed before clay base prepared within proposed footprint.

Environmental Assessment

Surface Water

- Environment Act Licence limits met prior to discharge.
 - Includes limits for total and dissolved metals, total suspended solids and total ammonia.
- Maximum pumping rate of 0.2 m³/s from the existing polishing pond.
- Discharge to occur during ice-off conditions, anticipated between spring thaw (June 15) and freeze-up (November 30). Pending approval of June 2011 NOA.
- Surface water samples regularly collected from polishing pond and receiving water bodies as part of the requirements of the Environment Act Licence and environmental effects monitoring program.

Groundwater

- No registered groundwater production wells within 1 km.
 - Groundwater elevation varies across site; 0.3 m to 6.1 m bgs observed.
 - Groundwater typically found in silt and/or sand layers.
- Proposed TMA Expansion lined with clay.
- Annual groundwater monitoring will continue as part of the requirements of the Environment Act Licence.









Water Quality Monitoring

- Ongoing Monitoring:
 - Metal Mining Effluent (MMER) Environmental Effects Monitoring (EEM)
- No detectable impacts on benthic endpoints



Environmental Assessment

Terrestrial

- Terrestrial study conducted in 2008 covered proposed TMA footprint and surrounding area.
 - Indicated site is similar to surrounding general area (min 13,500 ha).
- Non-vegetative terrestrial species located within project site have ability to migrate into surrounding similar habitat with little disturbance anticipated.
- Several species at risk observed/proposed to occur within general area:
 - Common Nighthawk, Northern Leopard Frog, Olive-sided Flycatcher, Rusty Blackbird, Whip-poor-will, Eastern Wolf, Woodland Caribou and Yellow Rail.
- Construction activities restricted between April 15 and July 31, with clearing and blasting activities generally occurring between November and April.

Aquatic

- No Name Creek has low aquatic productivity (intermittent classification by Province of MB).
- Based on historical findings, year-round fish habitat only provided in deeper areas within the creek, including beaver ponds downstream of Vanson Road.
- Common species include:
 - Finescale dace, Fathead Mudminnow, Central Mudminnow and Brook Stickleback.
- Treated water pumped from the TMA into No Name Creek once water quality meets applicable licence criteria, at maximum licenced pump rate of 0.2 m³/s.

Environmental Assessment

Dust and Exhaust Emissions

- Construction and decommissioning activities will generate typical dust and exhaust emissions.
- During operation, exhaust emissions are expected to be similar to the existing TMA operation.
- Will follow fugitive dust plan proposed in June 2011 NOA.

Noise

- Construction and decommissioning noise will be typical of heavy equipment (graders, backhoe, etc.).
- Potential noise effects during construction as a result of blasting activities if required, however limited to early portion of construction.
- During operation, noise effects are expected to be similar to the existing TMA operation.

Heritage Resources

- Heritage Resources Survey completed in 2009 did not identify cultural resources.
 - A very low potential for archaeological resources in the low-lying project area.

Traffic

- Potential temporary traffic delays on PR 304 during blasting.
- Traffic associated with construction anticipated to be minimal (similar to the 2011 dyke raise).
- During operation, traffic volumes expected to be similar to the existing TMA operation.









Decommissioning Plan

- Tasks to be included in the decommissioning of the proposed TMA Expansion:
 - Separator dykes within proposed TMA Expansion and between existing and proposed new polishing ponds lowered.
 - Removal of pipelines, pump stations, electrical power lines and proposed access roads.
 - Re-contouring and re-vegetation of downstream dyke slopes, proposed new main pond surface, tailings pipeline trenches and disturbed areas.
 - Continued monitoring of surface water, groundwater, re-vegetation growth and erosion until deemed no longer required by applicable regulators.









Next Steps

- Finalize Environmental Assessment for proposed TMA Expansion
- Submit Environment Act Proposal for provincial review:
 - Fall 2011
- Start construction activities (pending regulator approval):
 - Late 2011/early 2012
- Proposed TMA Expansion Commissioning:
 - -2013
