A proposal has been filed by Alliance Engineering Services Inc., on behalf of the Frontier School Division, pursuant to *The Environment Act* for the construction and operation of a new wastewater treatment plant (WWTP) located on Lot 63, in the settlement of Norway House, Manitoba. The new WWTP will replace the existing WWTP at Jack River School and consists of the following key process components: a new equalization tank, a Bio-WheelTM Tank using an integrated fixed film and activated sludge process, a new clarifier tank and a final ultraviolet (UV) disinfection system. Treated effluent will be discharged into the Jack River via an existing 100 mm diameter outfall.
