- June 6 – 8 **Hooked on Fishing** – Cast your line to see if you can get hooked on fishing. Whether you're already a pro or trying for the first time, fishing is fun for the whole family.
- June 13 – 15 **A Murder of Crows** – Look up, look way up. Ever wonder what kind of birds you see? Soar with the Interpreters and learn about the birds of Hecla Island
- June 20 – 22 **Bear with Us** - Did you know this is bear country? Hecla has a healthy bear population. Learn what you can do to be more bear safe.
- June 27 – 30 **Welcome to Mikley** – Hecla Island has a rich history. Go back in time with the Interpreters as they uncover some of Hecla's past.
- July 4 – 6 **Wild On Hecla Island** – There is a hierarchy in the animal kingdom, even on Hecla Island. Take a walk on the wild side with the Interpreters as they unravel Hecla's food web.
- July 11 – 13 **Hecla Rocks!** – Hecla Island's shores have a story to tell. Join the Interpreters as they expose Hecla's rocky foundation
- July 18 – 20 **Parks Day Weekend** – Manitoba has some beautiful provincial parks. Come investigate with the Interpreters to find out what the parks have to offer.

- August 1 – 4 **Hecla's Yearbook** – The Icelanders arrived on Hecla Island in 1876. Flip through the pages of Hecla's past with the Interpreters and discover that it wasn't all that easy.
- August 8 – 10 **Hecla Bear-ies** – You can pick the blueberries, raspberries, and saskatoons, but these bear-ies should be left alone. Bears are one of Manitoba's largest mammals. Find out how we can live in harmony with them and stay safe.
- August 15 – 17 **Wolf it Down** – Wolves have had a hard time in the past. Join a pack of Interpreters to learn about the misconceptions wolves have had to deal with in the last century. Send chills down your spine and participate in an evening howl.
- August 22 – 24 **Don't Flounder** – Something's fishy on Hecla Island. Reel in the facts about Hecla's main industry, commercial fishing.
- August 29 – Sept. 1 **A Deep Freeze** – Animals have different adaptations that help them survive the coldness of Manitoba's winters. Come warm up with the Interpreters and find out what animals do to get ready for and survive the winter.
