### Hikes

#### A. Spirit Sands

Explore this unique landscape and learn about geology, diversity, adaptations, or human impact on the prairies. This 3.2km hike takes about an hour and a half. Be sure to wear good walking shoes and bring a container of water.

#### B. Isputinaw

This trek takes you from the wetlands, to the forest, to the prairie. Compare the eco-systems and see for yourself the diversity present in a short hike. This 1.2km hike takes half an hour to 45 minutes.

### Activities

#### C. Map and Compass

Through various games and activities, students will learn simple map reading skills and the very basics of compass. After a 45 minute introduction, the adventurous could test out their newfound skills on the Spruce Woods orienteering trail (allow 90 minutes).

#### D. Habitats

Have to have a habitat! Learn the components of a habitat. Learn about some of the special creatures in Spruce Woods and the special adaptations they have so that they can make this their habitat. What happens when things change?

#### E. Wetlands

Meet the chef who makes the best marsh soup! Learn all the ingredients necessary to make your own marsh soup! What are wetlands and what role do they play in our lives. Just how important is water?
