Campground Tips

- Be sure matches are extinguished. Break them in half before discarding.
- Build no fires except in a designated firepit or use a camp stove. Before leaving make sure your fire is completely out.
- Be careful with your cigarettes, cigars and pipe ashes. Crush them thoroughly before discarding. Never toss them from a vehicle.
- Please! Do not litter.
- Be sensitive to wildlife. Bears can be dangerous and should not be fed. Food must be stored away from your campsite, preferably in a locked vehicle, to avoid attracting hungry animals. Do not store food in your tent.
- Warm clothing is needed for cool nights.
- The use of insect repellent will add to your comfort.
- Learn to recognize and avoid poisonous plants such as poison ivy.
- In case of injury or illness contact a Campground Attendant or Park Patrol Officer. They can assist you to reach medical help.
- Canoeists and hikers travelling in backcountry areas should advise a friend of their intended destination and anticipated length of trip.
- Backcountry camping is only allowed at designated campsites.
- It is illegal to use or transport elm firewood.
- Out of Province Firewood can spread harmful pests and destroy our forests - buy it locally, burn it locally.

- The blue jewel of southwestern Manitoba



Get away and enjoy the day at the blue jewel of southwestern Manitoba - Adam Lake Campground in the Turtle Mountain Provincial Park. The campground is made up of four bays: Hartley, Breadon, Sharpe and Oskar with a total of 45 electrical sites and 36 water and electrical sites. Lakeview Bay, located 2 km south, offers 24 basic sites.

A swimming area, grass volleyball court, baseball diamond and playgrounds are all near the beach and campground, ready for outdoor action. Picnic areas and shelters are located near the beach for a day out by the water. Go for a relaxing canoe trip on shallow Adam Lake. Check out the interpretive centre and enjoy entertaining and informative programs about the history of the park.

Try a unique workout on the 2.5 kilometre loop Adam Lake Fitness Trail. Or take a leisurely walk on one of the four hiking trails that start at Adam Lake and vary in length from 5 kilometres to 15 kilometres. For the more adventurous, bring your own horse and enjoy our equestrian trails. Take the Wildlife Viewing Trail to the viewing tower and watch for moose and white-tailed deer. Listen for the haunting call of loons on the lake.

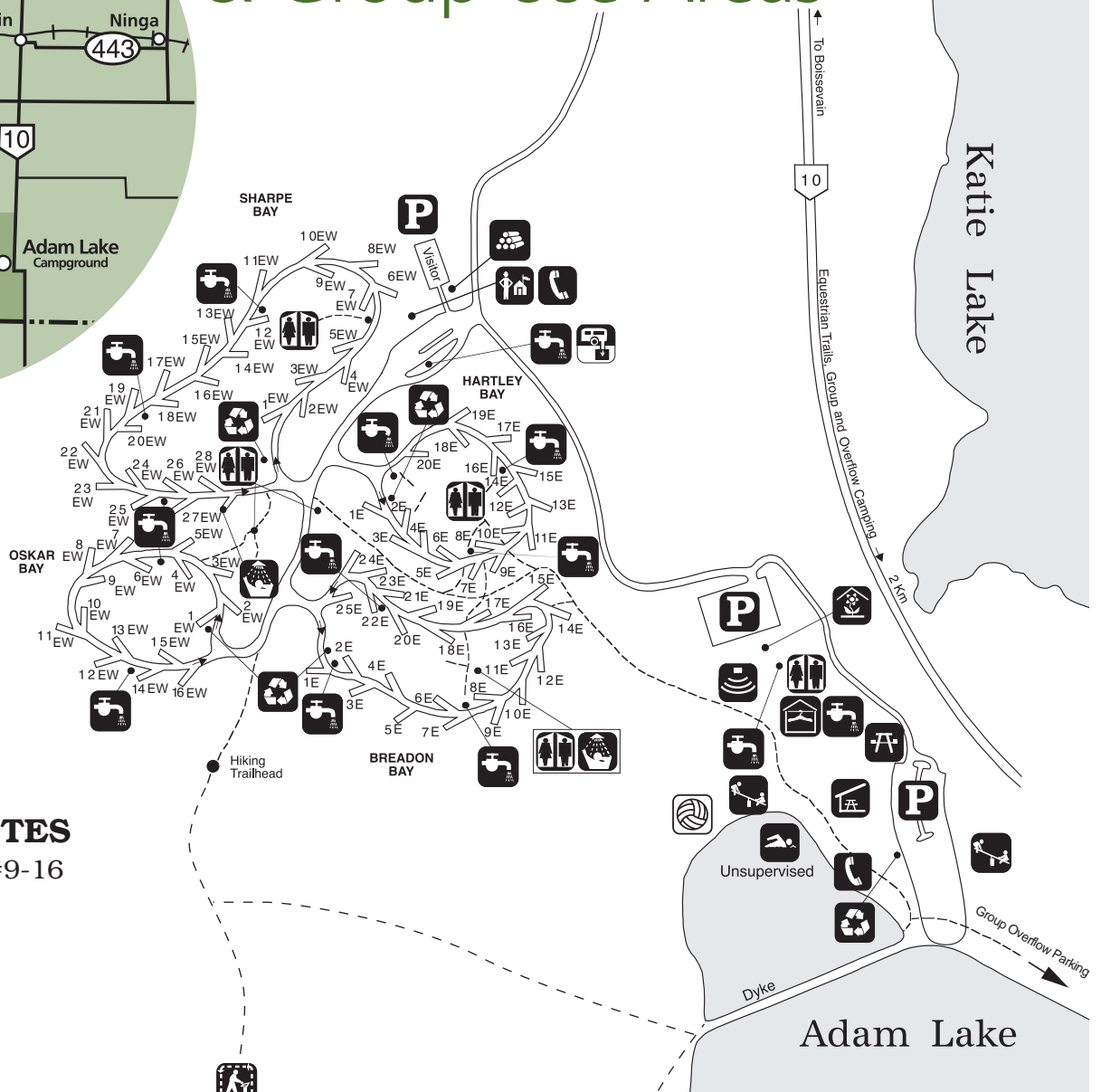
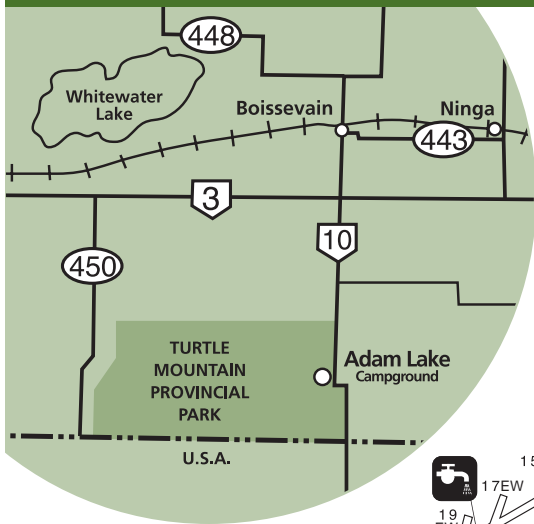
Adam Lake Campground is located just off Highway #10 near the Canada/United States border.

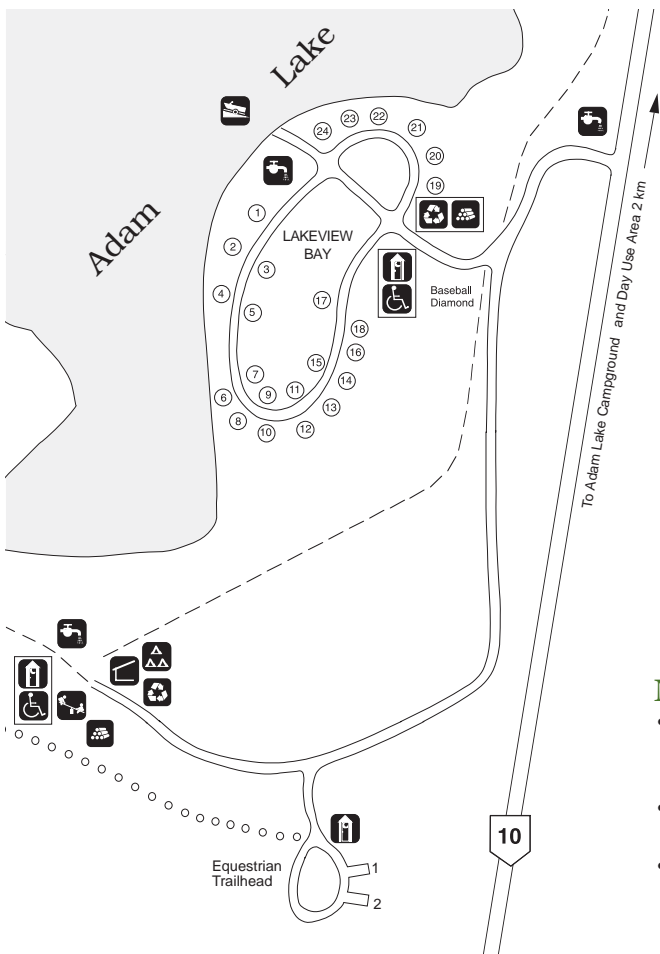
