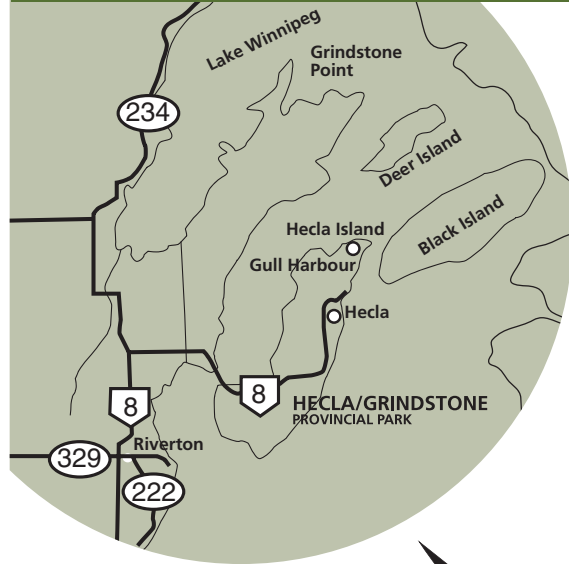

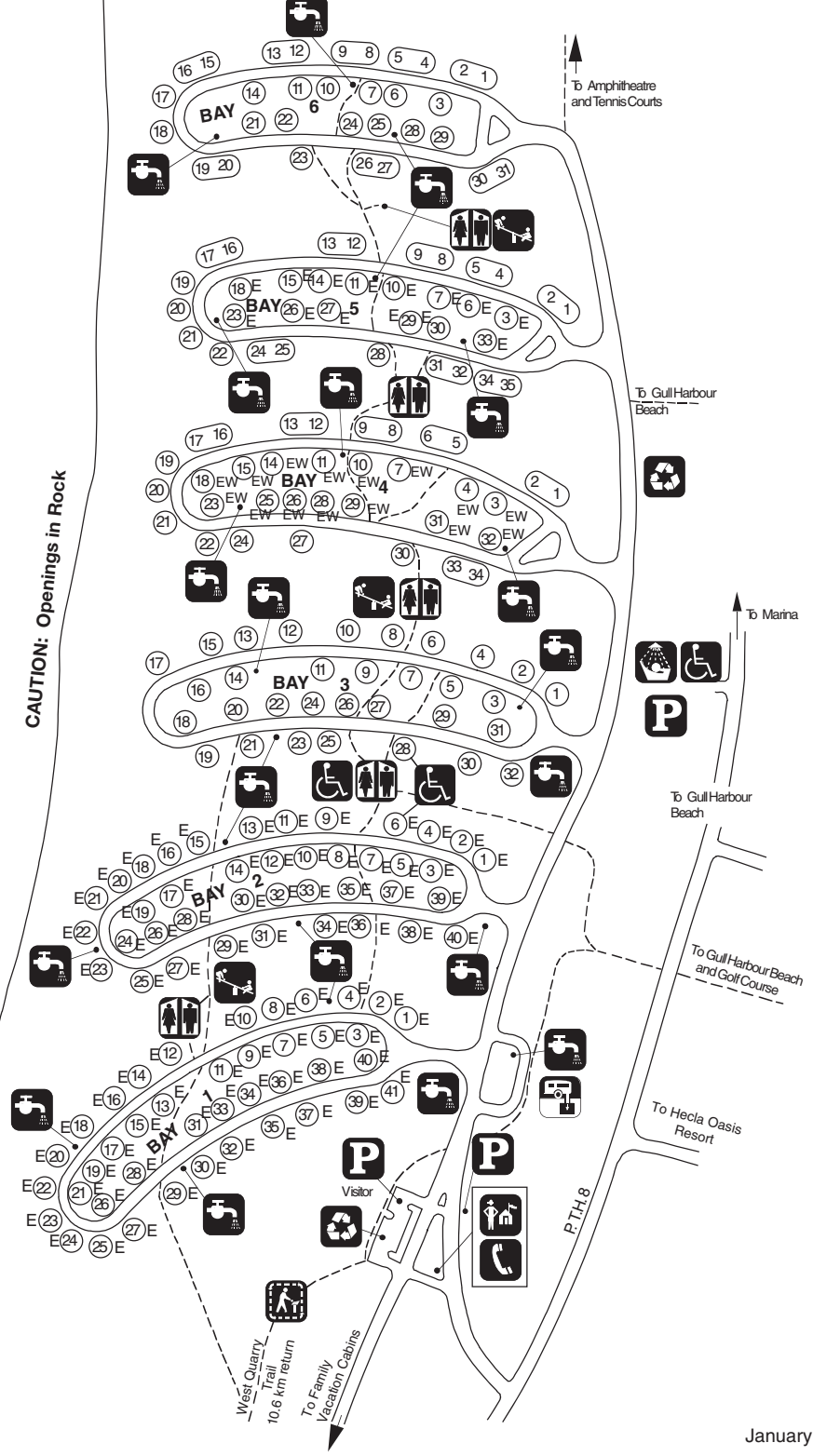

Hecla / Grindstone

- Visit Hecla Village, play on the beaches or walk the limestone cobbled shores



The sun warming your skin on the beach... creaking floors of restored historic buildings... sparkling waters surrounding the catch of the day ... everyone will find their own special experience at Hecla/Grindstone Provincial Park. A peninsula of land, a series of islands and adjacent waters in Lake Winnipeg combine to form this unique park.

hearing wolves answer an interpreter's call or watch as your children create nature crafts in the Hecla Village School.

At Grassy Narrows Marsh, climb the wildlife viewing tower or spy through the marshland spotting scope to see wetland birds like the great blue heron and yellow-headed blackbird. Fish for your supper or enjoy activities at the playgrounds, tennis courts, beach, picnic areas, boat dock and marina with boat rentals.

Championship golf awaits at one of Manitoba's most famous 18 hole golf courses. From your panoramic view on the hiking and bicycle trails, catch a glimpse of moose, wolves or bald eagles.

The annual commercial fishing demonstration and fish fry is popular with park visitors. Hecla's Eagle Fest is a weekend filled with an exploration of the Bald Eagle's habits and haunts. For a unique overnight experience stay at the Solmundon Gesta Hús (Icelandic for guest house) a bed and breakfast overlooking Lake Winnipeg.

Campground Tips

- Be sure matches are extinguished. Break them in half before discarding.
- Build no fires except in a designated firepit or use a camp stove. Before leaving make sure your fire is completely out.
- Be careful with your cigarettes, cigars and pipe ashes. Crush them thoroughly before discarding. Never toss them from a vehicle.
- Please! Do not litter.
- Be sensitive to wildlife. Bears can be dangerous and should not be fed. Food must be stored away from your campsite, preferably in a locked vehicle, to avoid attracting hungry animals. Do not store food in your tent.
- Warm clothing is needed for cool nights.
- The use of insect repellent will add to your comfort.
- Learn to recognize and avoid poisonous plants such as poison ivy.
- In case of injury or illness contact a Campground Attendant or Park Patrol Officer. They can assist you to reach medical help.
- Canoeists and hikers travelling in backcountry areas should advise a friend of their intended destination and anticipated length of trip.
- Backcountry camping is only allowed at designated campsites.
- It is illegal to use or transport elm firewood.
- Out of Province Firewood can spread harmful pests and destroy our forests - buy it locally, burn it locally.
