Campground Tips

- Be sure matches are extinguished. Break them in half before discarding.
- Build no fires except in a designated firepit or use a camp stove. Before leaving make sure your fire is completely out.
- Be careful with your cigarettes, cigars and pipe ashes. Crush them thoroughly before discarding. Never toss them from a vehicle.
- Please! Do not litter.
- Be sensitive to wildlife. Bears can be dangerous and should not be fed. Food must be stored away from your campsite, preferably in a locked vehicle, to avoid attracting hungry animals. Do not store food in your tent.
- Warm clothing is needed for cool nights.
- The use of insect repellent will add to your comfort.
- Learn to recognize and avoid poisonous plants such as poison ivy.
- In case of injury or illness contact a Campground Attendant or Park Patrol Officer. They can assist you to reach medical help.
- Canoeists and hikers travelling in backcountry areas should advise a friend of their intended destination and anticipated length of trip.
- It is illegal to use or transport elm firewood.
- Out of Province Firewood can spread harmful pests and destroy our forests - buy it locally, burn it locally.

William Lake Campground in Turtle Mountain Provincial Park offers 51 basic campsites and two small group use areas. The campground is equipped with all the amenities you'll need for your outdoor adventure, including a water supply, firewood, modern washrooms, showers, picnic area, picnic shelters and a fish cleaning area. A playground, volleyball court, and horseshoe pitch add to the day's fun. William Lake has a swimming and beach area and an amphitheatre for weekend interpretive shows. One boat dock is located around William Lake.

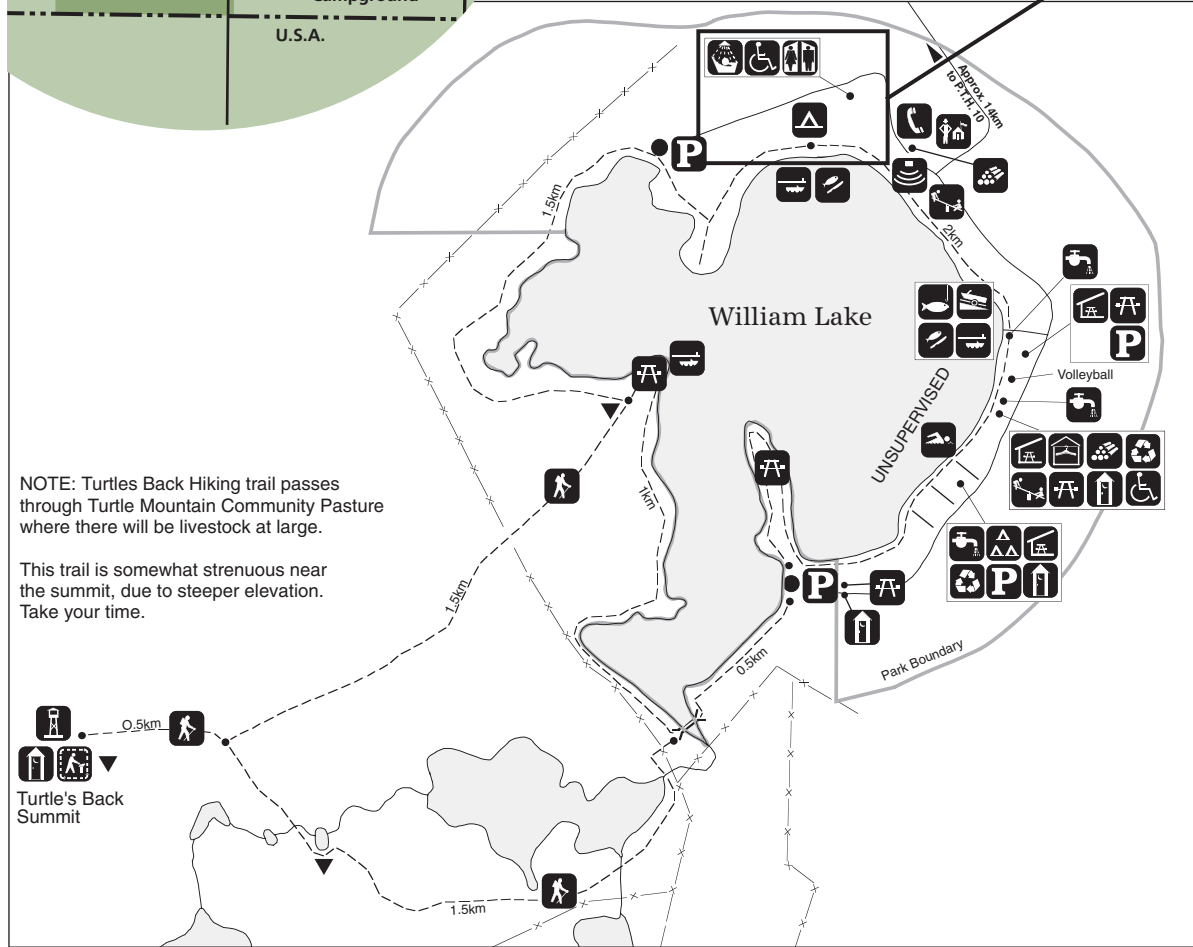
Explore Turtle's Back Trail on your way to Turtle's Back Summit and a spectacular view of southwestern Manitoba including the peacetower at International Peace Garden. This trail passes through Turtle Mountain Community Pasture where local livestock roam and graze. Steep elevation near the summit makes this trail a challenging yet rewarding hike.

William Lake Campground is located east of Highway # 10 and south of Highway #3.

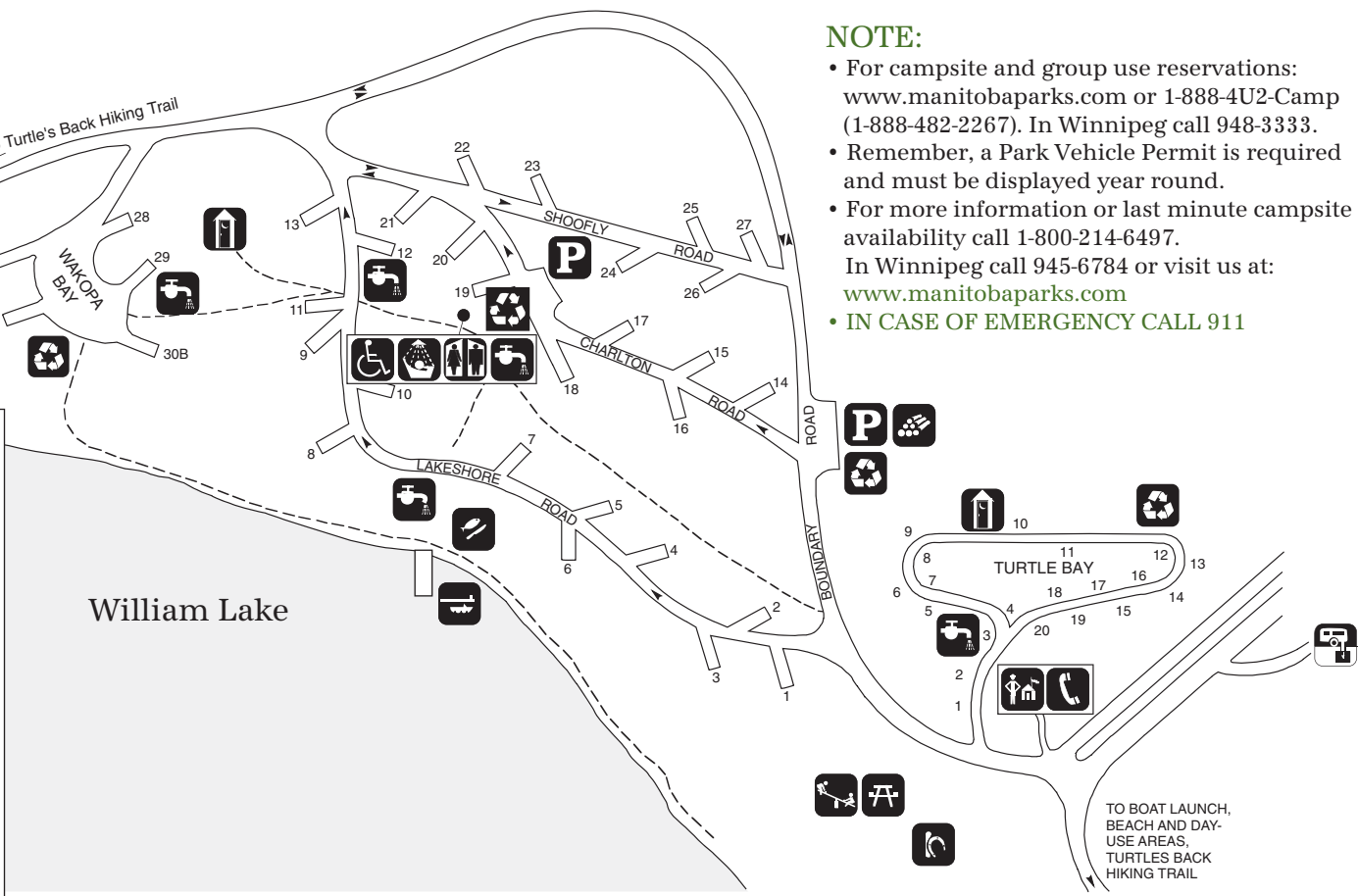
