The key role is to provide a safe and enjoyable environment within provincial parks. You are the type of person that likes a challenge; one that is resourceful and versatile. ### Required qualifications candidates must have:

- Completion of year one of a recognized resource management diploma or degree program (e.g.- University College of the North, Saskatchewan Institute of Applied Science and Technology, Lethbridge College, Vancouver Island University, Fleming College and Holland College) or year one of an undergraduate degree - prior to May 2012 or an equivalent combination of education, training and experience.
- Basic knowledge of law enforcement
- Ability to communicate clearly to a broad spectrum of clients
- Ability to work effectively under stress in hostile or adverse environmental conditions
- Ability to make decisions and problem solve
- Good writing skills

### To be considered for this position, candidates must meet the following Conditions of Employment:

- A valid full Manitoba class 4 drivers licence (an equivalent out of province licence is acceptable) and copy received by March 30, 2012.
- A clear criminal record check - must not have been convicted of a Criminal Offence for which a pardon has not been granted. A current valid original check must be obtained from your local police agency and must not expire before June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2012.
- Physically able to perform the duties required (P.A.R.E. or acceptable equivalent is an asset);
- Must not be on the Manitoba Child Abuse Registry. - Successful candidates must complete the Park Patrol Officer Course in May 2012 for which Manitoba Conservation will cover room and meals. After successful completion of this course, mileage expenses to assigned district will also be covered.
