- Ability to work independently with minimal direction or supervision;
- Effective verbal, written and interpersonal skills;
- Effective decision making, analytical and problem solving skills;
- A valid class 5 driver's licence (full-registration)\*; class 4 will be required by April 30, 2009\*;
- Canadian Firearm Safety Course or valid Firearms licence\*;
- Valid Standard First Aid & CPR certificates\*;
- Physically able to perform the duties and responsibilities required of the position;
- Ability to work effectively under stress in hostile or adverse environmental conditions;
- Demonstrated knowledge of provincial park laws and regulations considered an asset.
