

Northern Rates – Basic Assistance for Single Persons, Couples Without Children and Two-Parent Families

EMPLOYMENT AND INCOME ASSISTANCE (EIA)

The Employment and Income Assistance Regulation sets out basic assistance rates. Basic assistance rates are for basic living expenses only. If shelter costs are needed, they are given IN ADDITION to the basic rates (see *Rental Guidelines and Security Deposits* sheet).

If you would like more information about rates, please contact your worker.

Northern rates apply to you if you live in an area of Manitoba that is west of Lake Winnipeg and north of the 53rd latitude, or east of Lake Winnipeg and north of latitude 51° 12' and if you are living in an independent living situation. These rates do not apply when you are living in a board and room situation or in residential care, community residences, personal care homes, hospitals or institutions.

If you live in Thompson, The Pas or Flin Flon or within a 16 kilometre radius:
