Manitoba Infrastructure is responsible for developing transportation policy and legislation, and managing the province's vast infrastructure network. To meet these responsibilities, the department delivers a wide range of programs and services that support Manitoba's economy.

Manitoba Infrastructure's transportation responsibilities include corporate policy and provincial legislation development, motor carrier safety and regulation enforcement, carrier permits and developing and implementing sustainable transportation initiatives.

The department's water control, drainage and transportation infrastructure management duties cover the construction, maintenance, and operation of 19,000 kilometres of all-weather roads, 2,200 kilometres of winter roads, over 21,000 bridges and culverts, 4,700 kilometres of drains, 75 dams, 61 reservoirs, 41 pumping stations, 24 northern airports, and many other components.

The department consists of the following divisions, agencies, boards and commissions:

- Corporate Services Division
- Emergency Management and Public Safety Division
- Engineering and Operations Division
- Water Management and Structures Division
- The department is also responsible for the oversight of the Medical Review Committee, Licence Suspension Appeal Board and Land Value Appraisal Commission.
