## Preface

The Annual Statistics provides material descriptive of the population of Manitoba. It includes statistics on the operations of the Health Programs such as Home Care and Mental Health. The utilization of hospital, medical, chiropractic, optometric, oral surgery, Pharmacare, and long term care services by residents of the province during the fiscal year April 1, 2008 - March 31, 2009 are also included. Some material on services pertaining to 2008/2009 and earlier years are included to permit comparison of one year to another.

The Regional Health Authorities have been actively involved in planning for the health service delivery for residents in each region of Manitoba. Where possible, statistical detail is provided by regional health authority.

The tables should be read in conjunction with the notes that precede the data in each Section. As well, the footnotes to the individual tables are important for a better understanding of the data.

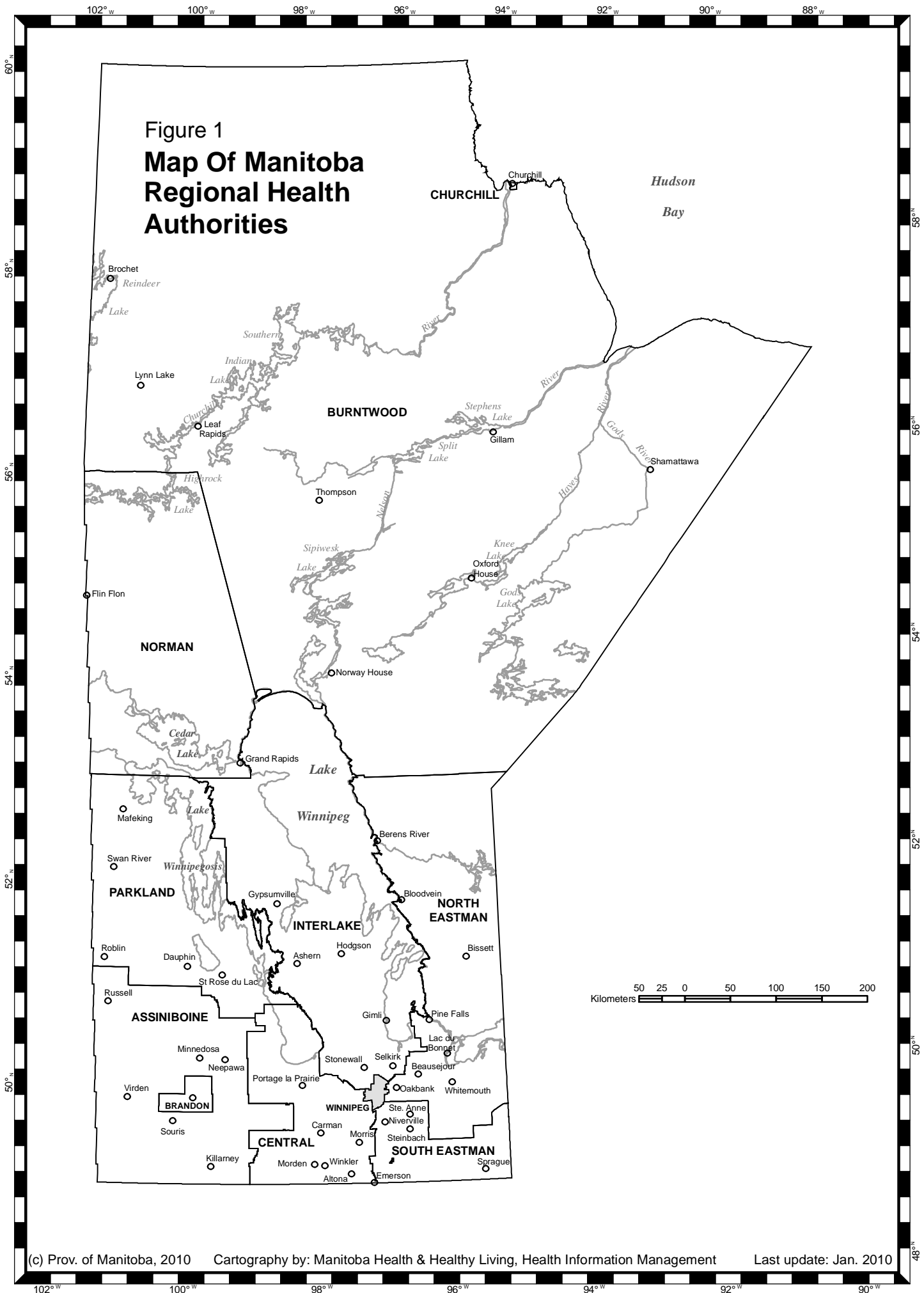
## Population

Part 1

The **population** data in this section are based on records of residents registered with Manitoba Health and Healthy Living on June 1, 2008.

On April 1, 1996, the Province of Manitoba converted the Health regions to Regional Health Authorities. This resulted in a shift of boundaries and a change in how the different local districts are distributed. First Nations residents are allocated to their municipality by postal code. Therefore, historical comparisons of regional data prior to 1996/1997 are not possible.

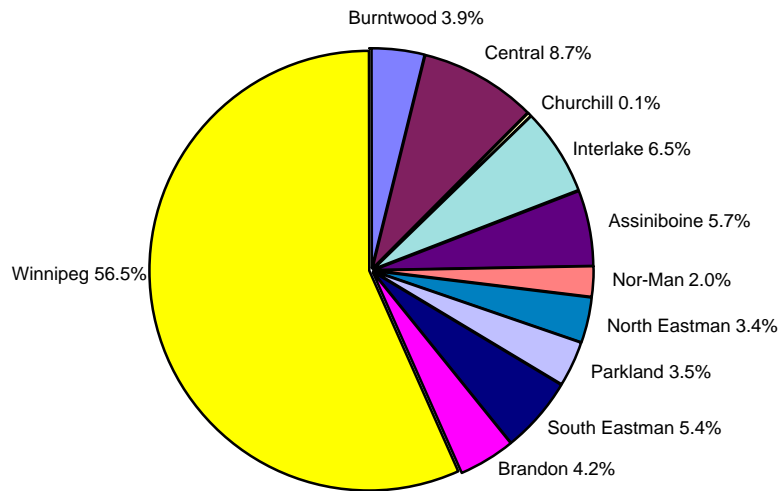

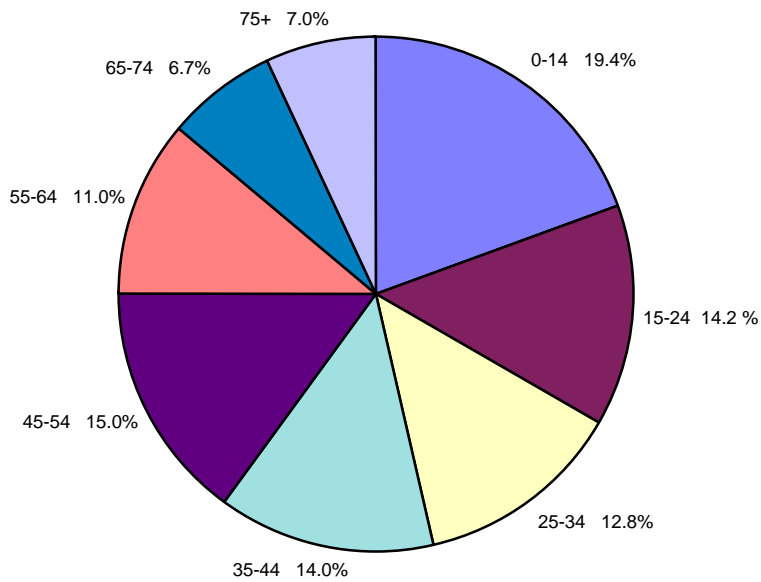

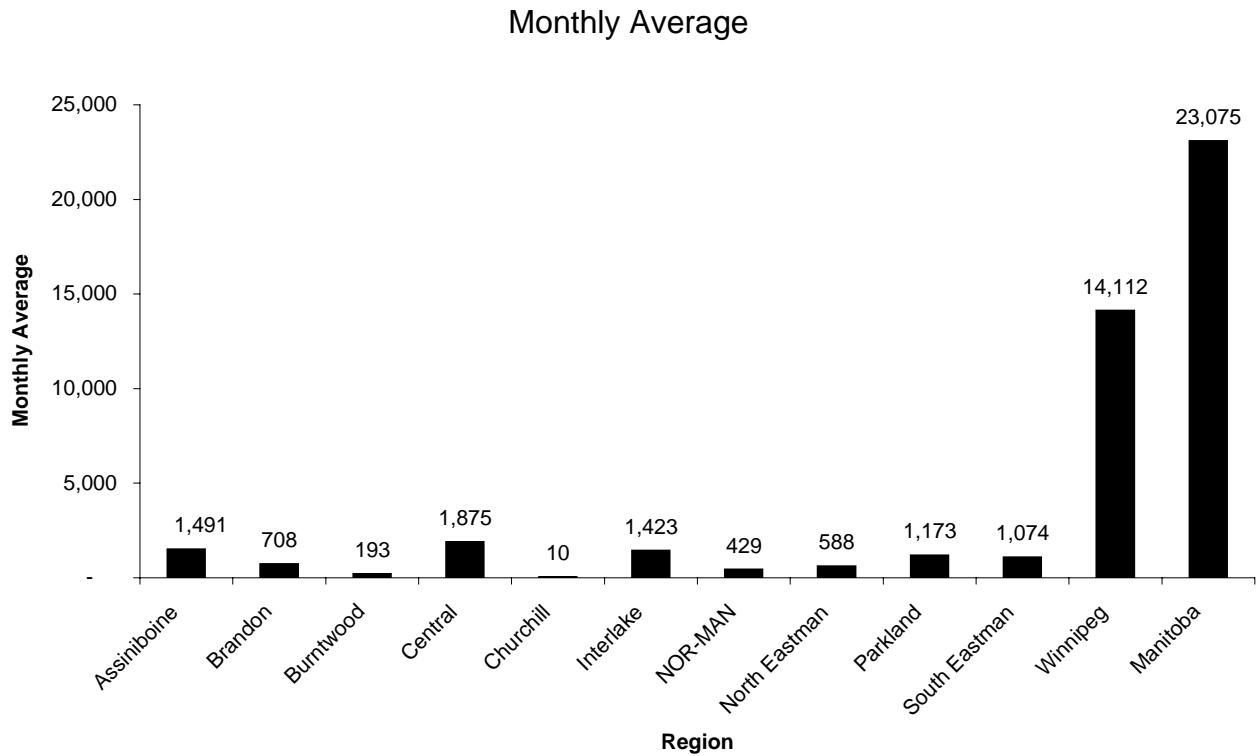

The **Selkirk Mental Health Centre** is a provincial mental health facility mandated to provide long term mental health inpatient treatment and rehabilitation services to all residents of Manitoba whose challenging treatment and rehabilitation needs cannot be met by other services. The Centre continues to provide short term and acute inpatient mental health services to Manitoba residents of the Interlake, North Eastman, South Eastman, and Churchill Regions. The Centre also admits acute patients from other regions as required.

The Centre has a formal agreement with the government of Nunavut, to provide inpatient services to residents of Nunavut experiencing mental illness.

Patient services are available at Selkirk Mental Health Centre in four specialized treatment programs: Short Term Treatment, Psychosocial Rehabilitation, Extended Treatment and Rehabilitation; and Forensic Rehabilitation.

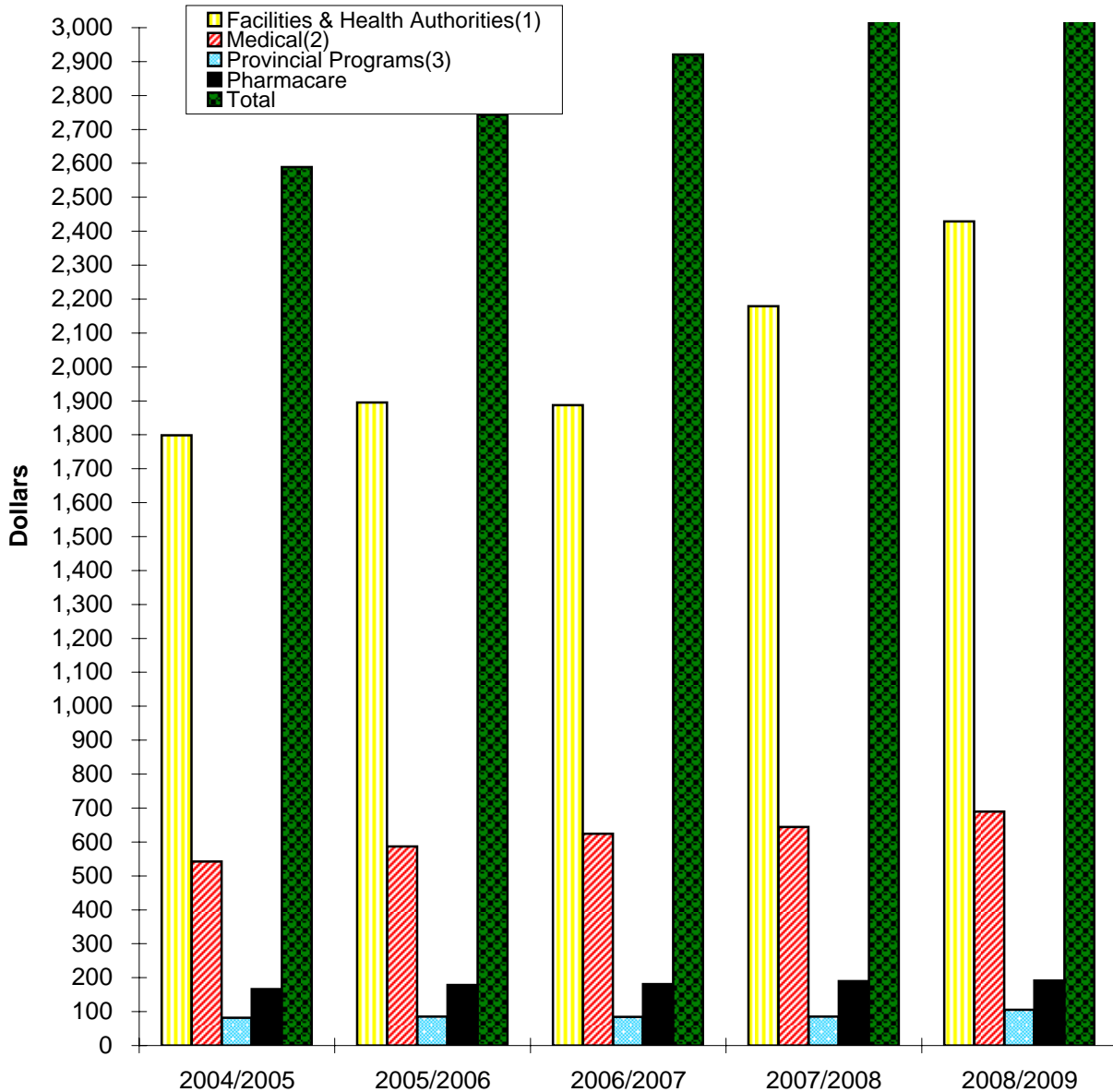

The information contained in this section is derived from the National Discharge Abstract Database.

Tables 1 - 3 are based on the Discharge Abstracts Database (DAD) and include data for those residents of Manitoba who were separated from hospital during the period April 1, 2007 - March 31, 2008. An Abstract is completed and submitted for each separated patient by all Manitoba hospitals and by hospitals outside of Manitoba providing services to insured residents of Manitoba.

In reviewing the data in this section the following definitions will be helpful:

**Acute Care Hospital** - A hospital that provides primarily for the diagnosis and short-term treatment of patients for a wide range of diseases or injuries.

**Rehabilitation and Chronic Care Hospital** - A hospital that provides services primarily for the treatment of patients requiring rehabilitation therapies and for the continuing treatment of patients with long-term illness or with little or no potential for recovery and who require equipment and professional supervision not usually provided in a personal care home.

**Separations** - The discharge or death of an in-patient from a hospital. The frequency counts show individual cases separated, not unique persons separated.

**Separated Days** - The accumulated in-patient days since admission of adults, children, and newborns, who were discharged from the hospital or who died in the hospital during the reporting year, including those admitted in previous years.

**Length of Stay** - Separated days per separation.

**Rate Per 1,000 Population** - Calculation is based on Table 1 in the Population Section, unless otherwise stated.

**Diagnostic Classification/Category** - Based on International Classification of Diseases, 10th Revision, Clinical Modification (ICD-10-CA).

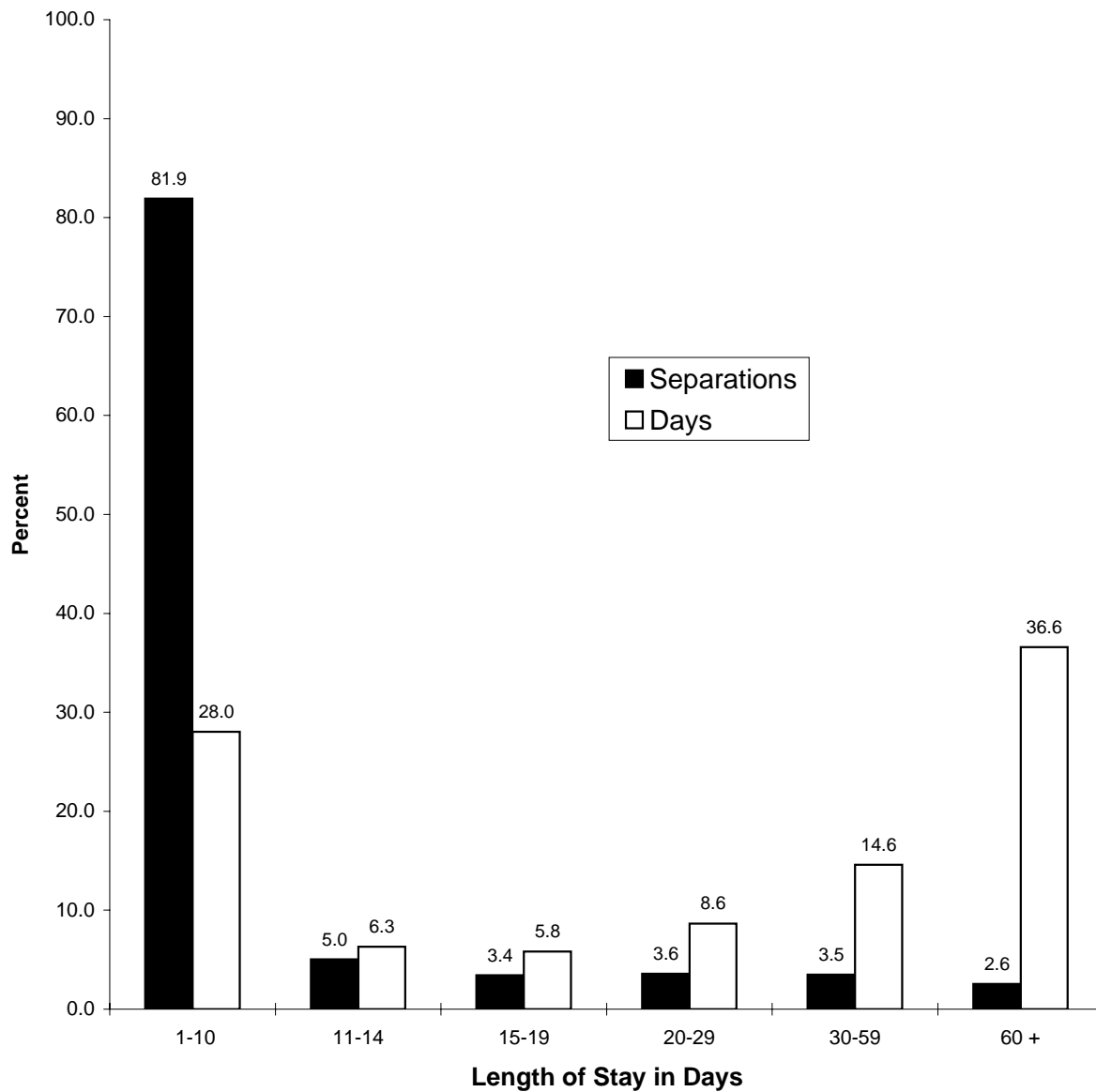

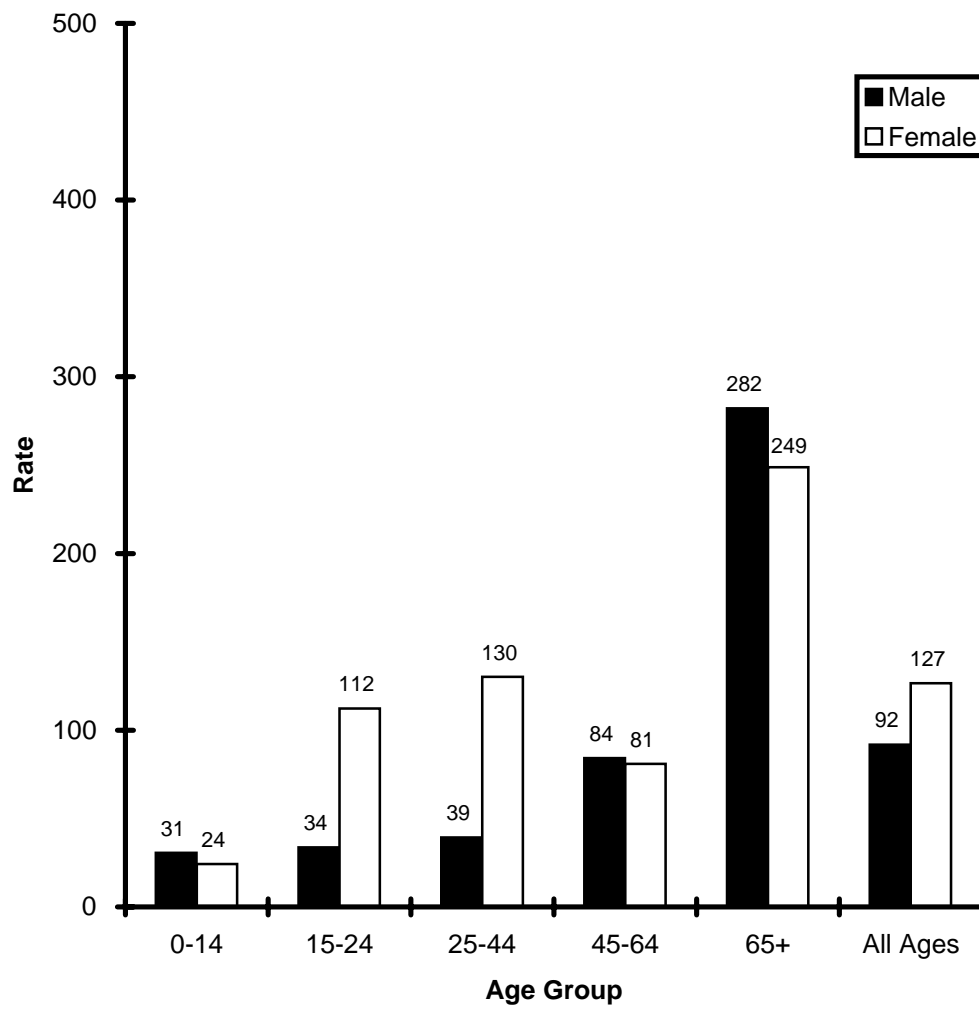

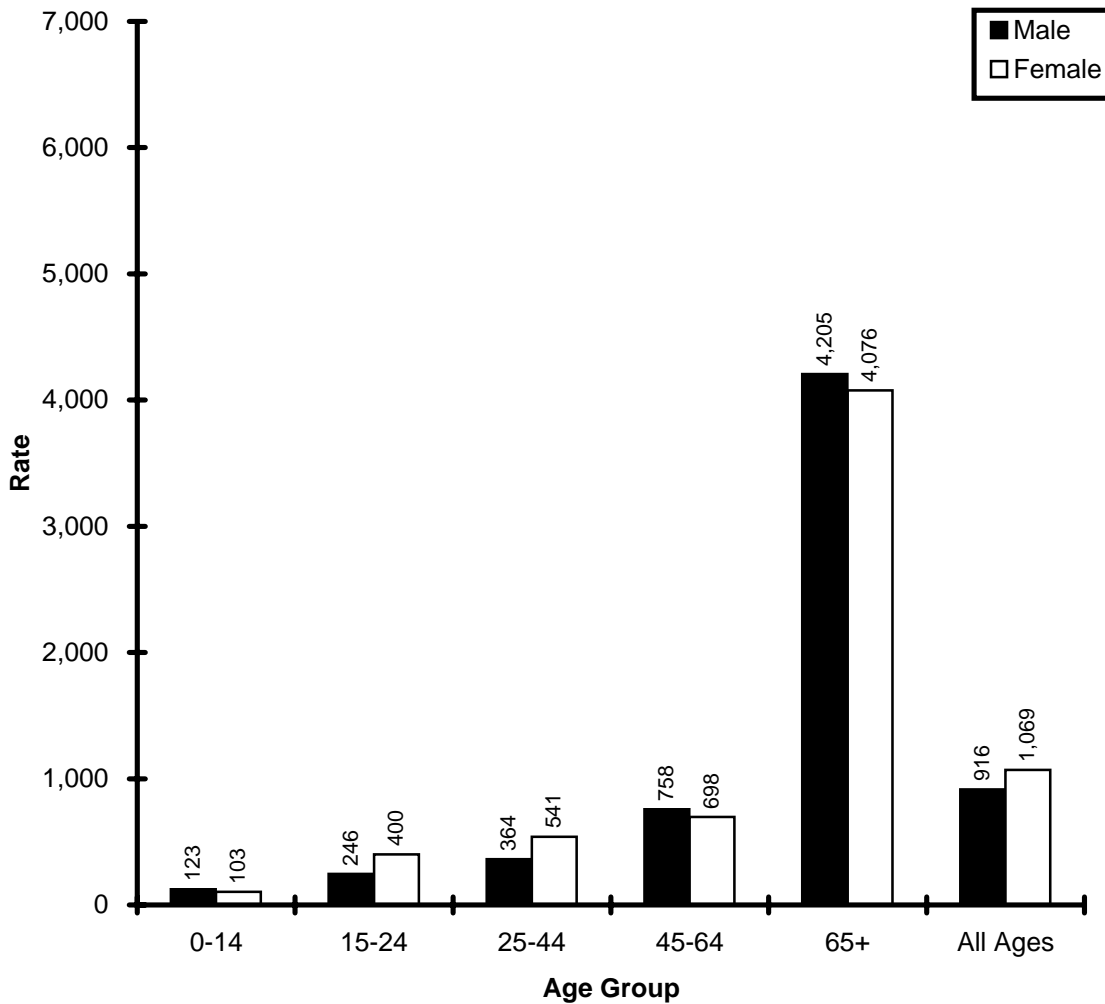

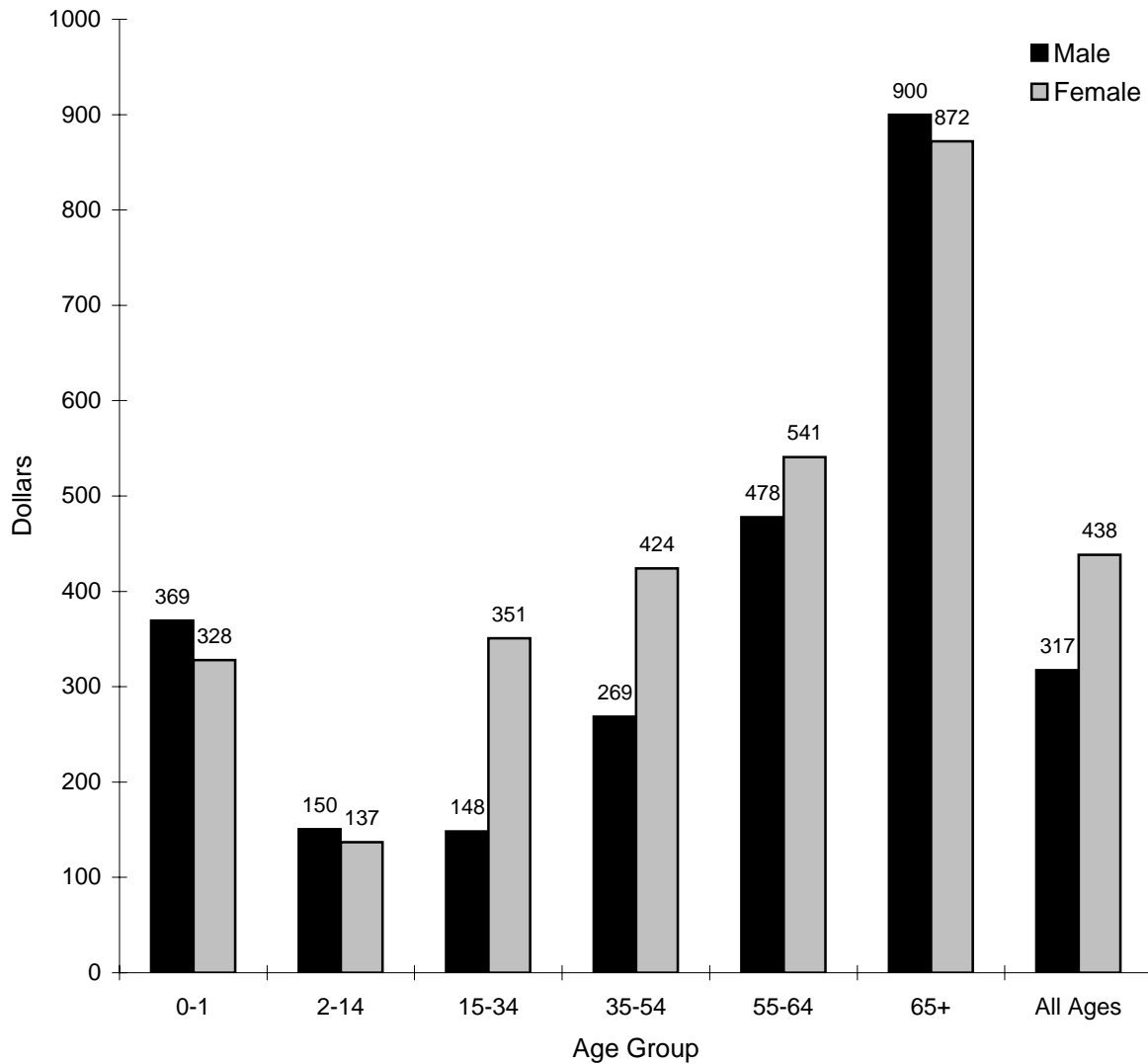

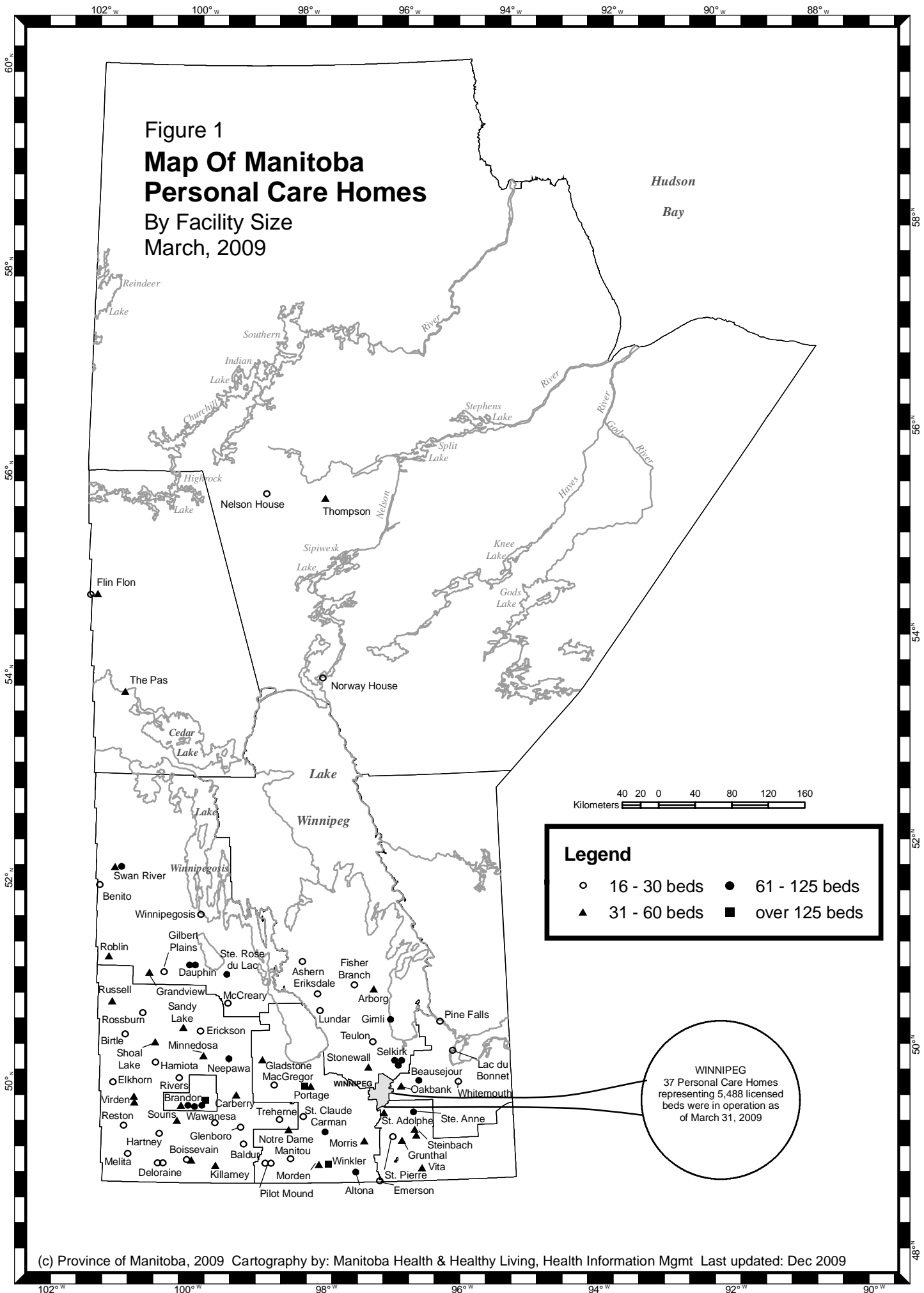

Manitoba Health and Healthy Living administers four distinct and separate drug benefit programs for Manitobans: Manitoba Pharmacare, Employment and Income Assistance participants, residents of personal care homes, and the Palliative Care Drug Access Program (PCDAP). It also administers a program that provides funding assistance for devices to help Manitobans with physical disabilities. Provincial Drug Programs does not include drug expenditures for hospital in-patients.

*Pharmacare* is a drug benefit program for any Manitoban, regardless of age, whose income is seriously affected by high prescription drug costs.

*Employment and Income Assistance (EIA)* covers the cost of essential drugs for its program participants only if coverage from another program or private insurance is not available.

Individuals who choose a hospital or *personal care home* for the final days of their life have their drug costs covered by the health care system.

*The Palliative Care Drug Access Program* provides deductible-free coverage through Manitoba Health. This program is designed for people at the end stages of their illness, when the focus of care is on comfort. By covering the cost of these eligible drugs for use in the home, a major financial burden is removed for the patient and their family.

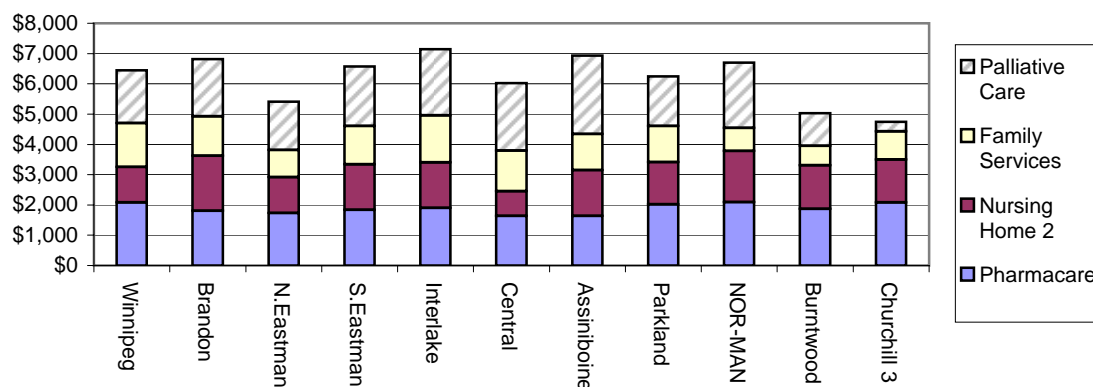
