UPDATED - Claims Submission Procedure: Pharmaceutical Distribution Rate Changes Non-Insured Benefits Branch Manitoba Health, Seniors and Active Living

Effective May 31, 2019

Please include this Procedure in your Drug Programs Information Network (DPIN) Manual under Section 4: Claims Submission.

- "Wholesale Upcharge" or "Pharmaceutical Distribution Rate" means any supplemental cost added by wholesale distributors to the published list price for a product to account for wholesale distribution, storage, and handling costs of pharmaceutical products.
- Effective May 31, 2019, the Pharmaceutical Distribution Rate will be as follows:

- Drugs on the "List of Designated High-Cost Drugs for Reduced Pharmaceutical Distribution include:
 - any drug with projected costs exceeding fifty thousand dollars over a 12-month period at average dosing and
 - o all oral Hepatitis C medications
- Drugs designated as high-cost drugs for reduced pharmaceutical distribution are published on the
 List of Designated High-Cost Drugs for Reduced Pharmaceutical Distribution. This list will be
 updated (if applicable) with the issuance of each future drug Bulletin and can be found at:
