- Primary care practice/ primary care system
- PIN is a key provincial priority in advancing primary care renewal.
- In areas such as QBIF and EMR utilization in Primary care, PIN is at the forefront of innovation in Canada.



Where we're going

PIN Phase 2

- Three years
- Fall 2008 - Fall 2011

Key Activities of Phase 2:

- Provide on-going Quality Based Incentive Funding (QBIF) and support to:
 - Agassiz Medical Centre,
 - Assiniboine Clinic (January), and
 - Dr. C. W. Wiebe Medical Centre.
- Convert Steinbach Family Medical Centre to a full PIN site.
- Recruit additional 65 family physicians.



Demonstration Site Timeline

Summer 2008 – Completion of Phase II Service Purchase Agreement(SPA) with Demonstration Sites

Fall 2008 – Call for applications for new sites

Fall 2008/Winter 2009: Phase II Sites selected

Spring/Summer 2009: New sites begin implementation process.

Fall 2009: Phase II QBIF Data collection begins for all sites

Summer 2008 – Deliverable teams developed

Fall 2008- Spring 2010 – Deliverable Work completed.



Data Collection & Analysis

- Develop a process for collecting, storing and analyzing data to support PIN evaluation and remuneration, within a broader strategy for Divisional and Departmental data collection & analysis.
- Identify and document processes, roles and responsibilities, required tools or systems and required human resources.



Funding & Remuneration

- Greater refinement of a Manitoba Quality Based Incentive Funding (QBIF) Model.
- Development of a staged implementation plan for QBIF.
- Identify a sustainable source of funding in addition to a sustainable compensation model.

Indicator Development

- Develop a process to identify and maintain a coherent set of primary care indicators. This process includes:
 - collection of existing indicators,
 - stakeholder engagement,
 - ongoing process for sustainability, and
 - linkages with appropriate inter-jurisdictional indicator bodies



Information Technology and Management Support

- Develop a process to support the collection of PIN indicators within computerized medical records (EMRs).
- Develop and maintain information management guide to help clinics collect PIN indicator data
- Help clinics develop data monitoring processes to improve PIN data collection practices
