Need to focus on the intended outcomes of the objectives, namely access, quality of care and healthy work lives.	Quality Based Incentive Funding linked to quality of care.

What We Heard	What We Did
Connection between EMRs and clinical practice, need for EMR requirements in primary care	EMR Qualification - PCISS
Change is not painless and requires ongoing attention	Continued change management support for sites, and working at team building
Physician work life and primary care access has not been addressed to date	Identified as priorities in Phase 2
Service coordination and role and responsibility definition between RHA and clinic	Support RHA and FFS linkages, discussions, and collaboration
Need to ensure Indicators are valid and reflect priorities	Department Deliverable identified on Indicator Development
