

REPORTABLE DISEASES AND CONDITIONS BY HEALTH PROFESSIONAL (HP) AND LABS (L)

Below are the communicable diseases that are monitored and controlled under the *Reporting of Diseases and Conditions Regulation (Sept. 19, 2006)* of *The Public Health Act*. A person suspected of having one of the diseases or conditions identified below **must** be reported to Manitoba Health, Public Health under the following circumstances:

- **If it is believed that the presence of the disease/condition will not be confirmed by a positive lab test and/or a positive lab test is not enough to determine presence of disease/condition**
- **At death**, if it is believed that the patient had the reportable disease or condition at the time of death or the reportable disease or condition contributed to the patient's death; or
- **At biopsy or autopsy**, if the person finds evidence of a reportable disease or condition.

Those diseases noted by an asterisk (*) require rapid notification (telephone).
