School	Description of event
Dauphin River School	Alcohol and Drug Abuse. A worker from our local Native Alcohol and Drug Abuse Program will deliver a presentation incorporating drama and a display table with information on effects and prevention.

We have also purchased walkie-talkies for the outdoor/indoor supervisors to use during recess, lunch and bus supervision.

Archwood School	Bicycle Safety Rodeo. We will have a guest speaker who was involved in a bicycle accident and he will talk about how his helmet saved his life. We have started a program in conjunction with our guidance counsellor called "second step". All K-8 classes are involved. At each level the focus is on empathy, problem solving, friendships and anger management. We recently had a speaker from CP Rail who discussed safety around railway tracks. We are also having a speaker in to discuss water safety.
Collège Jeanne-Sauvé	Hosting the PARTY program. We will also have the SADD committee of our school hosting a video presentation prepared by MPIC on the dangers of drinking and driving.
École Varennes	Inviting a guest speaker to present information about bullying and violence prevention - would also include some information about Human Rights. This presentation would target all students and staff. Hosting a contest (art, poem, song, etc.) related to injury prevention.
Glenwood School	We are currently developing an anti-bullying program. We have surveyed staff and will survey students to gather information regarding the scope of this problem. We have also sent information home to parents. Our next step is research and purchase support material for classrooms and to provide professional development to our school community of students, parents, and staff.

Highbury School	We have several "special needs" students in our school some who have experienced bullying and a lack of empathy by other students. École Howden	Students will take part in the creation of small murals promoting strategies to solve conflicts in a peaceful manner. This will enable students to be reminded of the necessary strategies to solve conflicts which could potentially cause injuries.
Island Lakes Community School	We have Peace Keepers at recesses who are middle-years students who go out with the early-years students to help them play fair, get along and resolve disagreements. This money would be used for a pizza lunch/thank you and training session.
J.H. Bruns Collegiate	Natural Helper Program. Events planned are drug and alcohol awareness, PARTY program, workshops on dealing with violence, safe sex, and mental health.
Marion School	Conducting bicycle safety lessons in the Early Years classrooms followed by a bicycle safety rodeo. For the actual rodeo, actual traffic signs will be rented; painting of line, etc. will need to be done prior to the event. Records will be kept as students demonstrate the various required skills. We will have an assembly to present certificates, and we will serve ice cream.

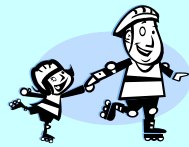
