To date, 56 of 96 projects have been completed....



Through a neighbourhood strategic planning process, residents of each neighbourhood area have defined key community values, needs and issues and have identified and endorsed a number of community projects to address them. Within the six designated neighbourhood areas, a total of 96 community recommended projects were approved and allocated funding through the Building Communities Initiative. While many projects have already been completed, most of the remaining projects will be implemented in 2006.

PROJECTS TO BE COMPLETED IN 2006

- 9 Aubrey Playground (50% complete) – new play structure, swings, climbing boulder and landscaping.
- 10 Wolseley Riverbank Access sites:
 - Canora Green – plantings, fencing, pathway, seating area and site furnishings.
 - Arlington Street End – plantings, seating area and site furnishings.
 - Aubrey Street End – benches, picnic table, waste receptacle and plantings
 - William Marshall/Dominion Street End – new stairs and deck, seating and fencing.
 - Greenwood Park – benches, landscaping

- 11 Westminster Streetscaping – creation of seating areas, street furniture, planters, banners and birdhouses.
- 12 Vimy Ridge Memorial Park – new water splash pad and wading pool, improved land drainage, lighting, additional play elements and site furnishings

*NOTICE: Vimy Ridge Wading Pool will be closed for the 2006 season for construction.

Wolseley Neighbourhood Beautification – design of a neighbourhood logo as well as installation of common street elements such as signs, banners, fencing and birdhouses throughout the neighbourhood.
