Anitoba's mining industry is thriving with the ongoing record-setting increases in metal prices. Spending on exploration in the province is forecasted to reach an all-time high of \$48.8 million in 2006. That's welcome news because exploration for new deposits is essential to the future of mining in Manitoba. But we're not done yet ... there is the ongoing challenge to successfully compete against other jurisdictions in a global and intensely competitive mineral investment market.

e've met this challenge by developing policies and programs that support exploration in the province. Companies are coming to Manitoba to explore because we offer attractive financial incentives, a stable and effective regulatory framework and ready access to high-quality geoscientific data. According to the 2006 Fraser Institute survey of mining companies, our strategy is working. The survey ranks Manitoba third worldwide for both its mineral policies and geological database.

It summarizes the Manitoba Geological Survey's geoscience investigations from the past year including new field programs, new digital initiatives, and collaborative ventures with the federal government, universities, and the mineral exploration industry.
