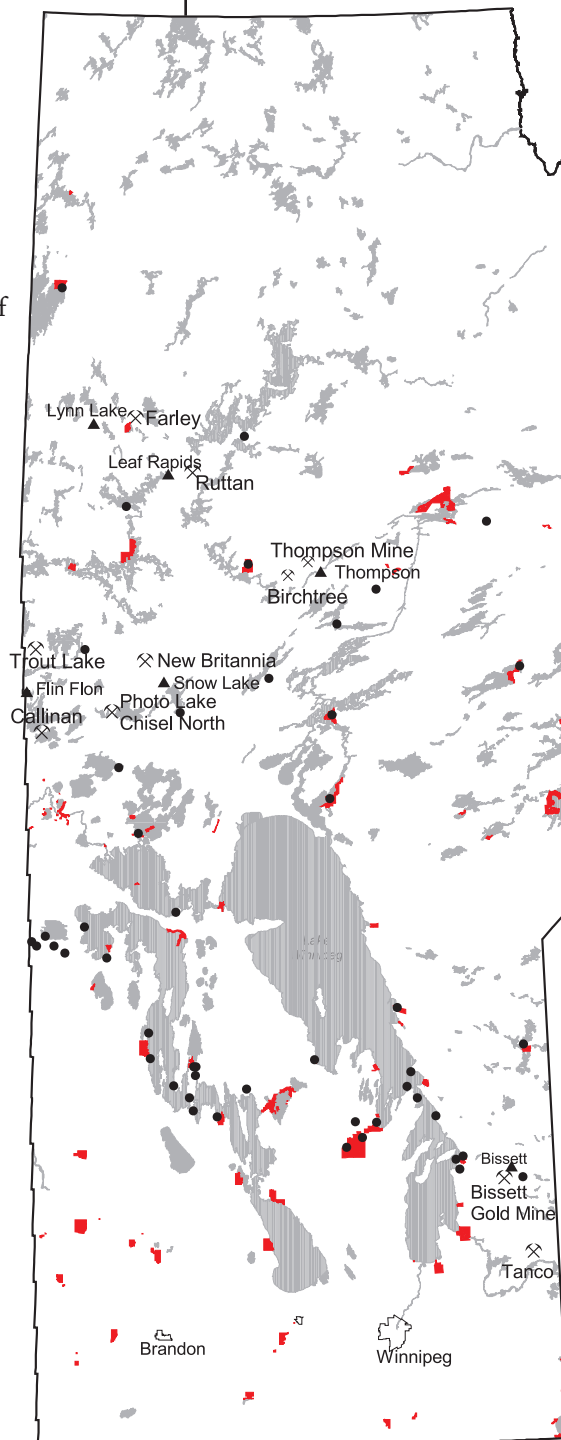

### MANITOBA'S ABORIGINAL PEOPLES

- Manitoba's Aboriginal population totalled 128,680 in 1996 census data (North American Indian 80,620, Metis 45,360).
- Aboriginal peoples represented 12 percent of Manitoba's population, the highest proportion among the Canadian provinces.
- More than one-third (36 percent) of Manitoba's Aboriginal population resided in Winnipeg.
- Manitoba's Aboriginal population is growing faster than the rest of the population and will constitute a growing share of Manitoba's population. It is estimated that, by 2016, Manitoba's Aboriginal population will be 15.3 percent.



### MANITOBA'S MINING INDUSTRY

- Mining is Manitoba's second-largest primary resource industry.
- The principal minerals and metals produced in Manitoba are nickel, copper, zinc, and gold.
- Other minerals and metals mined in Manitoba are dolomite, peat, silver, cesium, spodumene, tantalum, lime, salt, gypsum, granite, limestone, sand and gravel.
- Manitoba mineral resources with promising potential for future economic development include platinum-group elements (PGEs), titanium, vanadium, chromite, silica and potash.
- Manitoba's major mining communities are Flin Flon, Thompson, Lynn Lake, Leaf Rapids, Snow Lake and Bissett.
