# **Community Overview**

# **History**

Bissett originally acted as the service centre for the San Antonio gold mine. During the 25 years from 1943 to 1968, some 200 employees produced 38,272.13 grams of gold and 6,108.62 grams of silver. The mine was closed down as being uneconomical. Since 1980/81, the mine has opened and closed several times. It is now in a care and maintenance phase.

### **Access**

The community is located on Provincial Road 304 about 256 kilometres (km) northeast of Winnipeg. This road has now been extended into the Nopiming Provincial Park and to Wallace Lake, 32 km to the east and southward through the park to Bird River Road. The road traverses a major recreation area and Bissett is one of two major entry points.

### Governance

The community was recognized in October 1972 and is represented by a mayor and council under The Northern Affairs Act.

### **Economic Overview**

Conservation, trapping and mining are major contributors to the local economy. Tourism and local services also provide income. Trapping is largely confined to registered traplines in the Hole River and Lac du Bonnet Registered Trapline (RTL) Zones. Bissett shares this RTL Zone with other nearby communities. Commercial fishing is not a large contributor to the local economy. The San Antonio gold mine when in production is a major contributor to the community. The Bissett Development Corporation is responsible for encouraging economic development in the area.
