Water

Water is pumped from Lake Winnipegosis into a

6.3 million litre reservoir by an automatic refill system. It is then treated by coagulation, filtration and chlorination in the water treatment plant and distributed by piped distribution system. Approximately 178 homes and other facilities are connected to the system. Manual pickup of water from the water treatment plant is available for non-connected customers.

Wastewater

A low-pressure wastewater collection system is connected to a three cell lagoon.

Waste Disposal

Solid waste pickup is Monday and Thursday. The site is located one km south of the community on PTH 20. This site is supervised and open 16 hours per week.
