Duck Bay

Community Overview

History

Duck Bay is situated on a peninsula on the western shore of Lake Winnipegosis, bordered on the south by the Pine Creek reserve.

Access

Road access is provided by Provincial Road 272 through the reserve to Provincial Trunk Highway 20 which goes 128 kilometres (km) south to Dauphin or 105 km west to Swan River.

Governance

The community was recognized in June 1971 and is represented by a mayor and council under The Northern Affairs Act.

Economic Overview

The region has a limestone, shale and sandstone base with light soil cover. It is sparsely forested and dotted with small lakes. Economic activity centres on commercial fishing, primarily on Lake Winnipegosis and Pelican Lake with some on the seven other lakes. Fish is marketed through two fish stations, the community and Winnipegosis. Trapping, with less importance, is done in open areas rather than registered traplines.
