
Duck Bay

Community Status

Duck Bay is situated on a peninsula on the western shore of Lake Winnipegosis. It is bordered on the south by the Pine Creek Indian Reserve. PR# 272 provides access through the reserve to PTH #20, which goes 128 kilometres south to Dauphin, or 105 kilometres west to Swan River.

The region has a limestone, shale, and sandstone base with light soil cover. It is sparsely forested and dotted with small lakes.

The community has been governed by a mayor and council under *The Northern Affairs Act*, since June 1971.

Water

Water is pumped from Lake Winnipegosis into a six million litre reservoir. The water is treated and distributed by lines to most of the homes. Manual water pick-up is available from the plant.

Economic Overview

The economic activity centres on commercial fishing. Fishing is primarily on Lake Winnipegosis and Pelican Lake. Seven other lakes provide some commercial fishing. Fish is marketed through two fish stations, the community, and Winnipegosis.
