# **Community Overview**

## **History**

The community developed beside the Chemawawin Cree Nation reserve. Both relocated to this site in 1962-63 as a result of the flooding of Cedar Lake caused by construction of the hydro dam on the Saskatchewan River where it enters Lake Winnipeg at Grand Rapids. Information relates to the non-reserve side, unless otherwise noted.

### **Access**

The community is located on the south shore of Cedar Lake 40 kilometres (km) by air west of Grand Rapids. Road access is provided by Provincial Road 327 which connects both Provincial Trunk Highways 6 and 10. Both Grand Rapids and The Pas are approximately 100 km from the community.

### Governance

The community is represented by a mayor and council under The Northern Affairs Act.

# **Economic Overview**

The area is a mixture of rock outcrops, small pockets of marsh and black spruce timber. Some timber can be selectively harvested. The most important economic activity is commercial fishing on Cedar Lake. The local fish station packs fish for transportation to The Pas. Community trappers share the Cedar Lake (Easterville) and Grand Rapids Registered Trapline Zones with Grand Rapids. Trapping is the second most important source of income.

An unattended limited maintenance 2,600' x 35' emergency gravel airstrip is located on the edge of the community. It is necessary to phone the nursing station in advance to arrange for use.

Water source is from wells. Water is chlorinated and pumped to two pumphouses and a standpipe. The administration building, nursing station and school facilities have running water supplied by the system. Water delivery is available to individual houses.

### Wastewater

Wastewater is delivered from holding tanks to the lagoon located on the reserve.

### Waste Disposal

There is a solid waste site located south of the community which is used by the reserve as well.

### **Schools**

The reserve operates the Chemawawin School, which serves 547 students from Nursery to Grade 12 from both the reserve and community. Phone: 204-329-2115.
