Herb Lake Landing

Community Overview

History

Herb Lake Landing is situated on the east shore of Wekusko Lake, originally a landing point on the trail from the Canadian National Railway Bay Line to a mine further north on the lake. When the mine closed, only the landing remained.

Access

It is approximately nine kilometres (km) north of Provincial Road (PR) 391 and 55 km southeast of Snow Lake. PR 391 is an all-weather paved road connecting to Provincial Trunk Highway (PTH) 6 and north to Thompson or to PTH 10 and southwest to The Pas.

Governance

Herb Lake Landing is represented by a contact person and defined as a settlement under The Northern Affairs Act.

Economic Overview

The many lakes, characteristic of the Precambrian Shield region, make the area suitable for sport fishing, hunting, wild rice and related tourist activities. Wild rice growing and harvesting are the major economic resources. Fishers deliver their fish to the Wabowden or Winnipeg fish station. Pulpwood cutting has taken place at various times.
