Incorporated Community of Nelson House

Community Overview

History

Two communities share the name Nelson House, Nisichawayasihk Cree Nation reserve and the adjacent non-reserve community incorporated in 2004. The community was built at its present location as a result of the Churchill River Diversion through the Rat River. Residents previously lived on the reserve, but established the community when adjustments to diversion plans were taking place. Information relates to the non-reserve side, unless otherwise noted.

Access

The community is situated on a bay on the north shore of Footprint Lake 75 kilometres west of Thompson. Provincial Road 391 and a community access road connects the community to Thompson or Leaf Rapids.

Governance

The community is represented by a mayor and council under The Northern Affairs Act.

Economic Overview

Economic activity is based on fishing and trapping. Fishers at Nelson House have their catch transported to either Leaf Rapids or Wabowden fish stations. Trapping is carried out in the Nelson House Registered Trapline Zone.


