Mallard is located on the southeast end of Waterhen Lake and neighbours the Skownan First Nation and the community of Waterhen.

The community is approximately 288 kilometres (km) northwest of Winnipeg, 96 km from Dauphin and 78 km to Winnipegosis to the southwest.

The community was recognized in May 1970 and is represented by a mayor and council under The Northern Affairs Act.

Economic activity centres on commercial fishing, trapping, some livestock production and a limited local service sector. Mallard is located in the Skownan Registered Trapline Zone.

Wastewater is collected by pipe and sent to a wastewater treatment plant. There are a few houses with their own tanks and wastewater hauled to the plant for treatment.

Solid waste is transported to a regional site in Waterhen. There is weekly pickup by the public works employee.


