Community Overview

History

Meadow Portage is located on a narrow strip of land between Lake Manitoba and Lake Winnipegosis and developed as ranching and agricultural activities took place in the area.

Access

The community is 16 kilometres (km) south of Waterhen and 48 km east of Winnipegosis.

Governance

The community has been recognized since 1970 and is represented by a mayor and council under The Northern Affairs Act.

Economic Overview

The terrain is suitable for mixed farming and woodlands operations. Ranching, farming, livestock and commercial fishing are central to the economy. Agriculture provides a modest income. Fishing is a secondary source with all activity taking place on Lake Manitoba and Lake Winnipegosis. The fishers bring their catch from both lakes to a private fish station in Winnipegosis.
